1. Fictional and Factual Worlds (A Theoretical Introduction)

This seminar provides the student with an initial, brief introduction to the logical semantics of possible worlds and its application to narrative theory. Subsequently, the main goal will be to compare the fictional worlds produced by literary texts and the factual worlds produced by factual texts; the typology of this relationship is an integral part of the seminar.
