Ivan Passer began as a collaborator of Miloš Forman's and a scriptwriter of his films. *Intimate Lighting* is his first full-length film. He continued his career in the United States after 1968. The story of *Intimate Lighting* is very simple. The impact of this movie is created by the atmosphere, not by the action. This is a story about the crisis of middle-age and the disillusionment of two friends, both of them talented musicians. Passer is close to the lyrical tradition of Czech cinema and he prefers to talk about his heroes with love.
