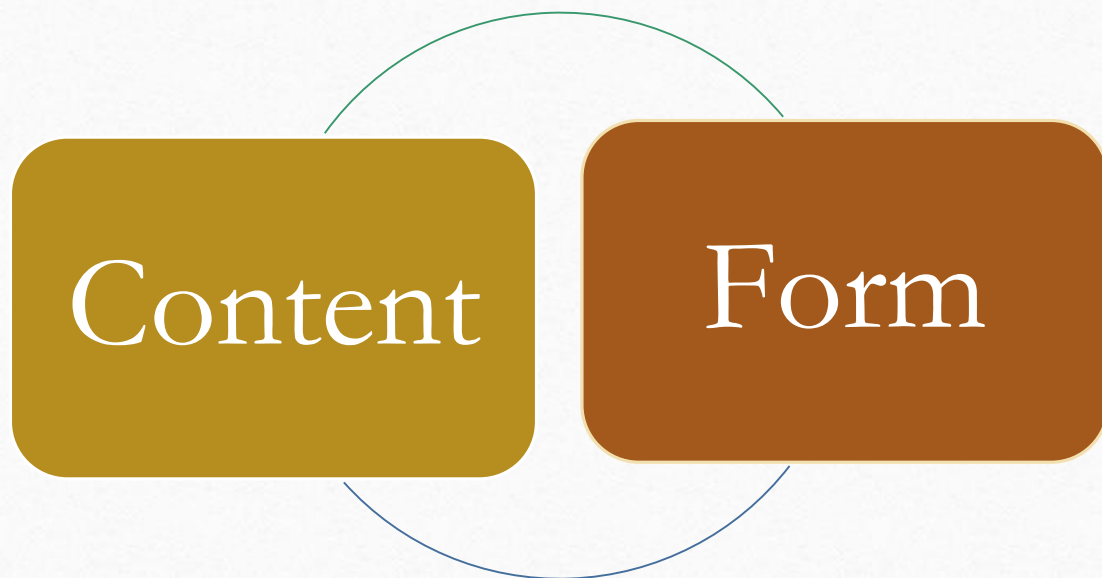

Keep It Simple and Succinct (KISS)



Research
proposal

1.

- Representative title for your project

2.

- Research statement with objectives and sub-questions,

3.

Design and methods—to discuss sample, data collection strategies, and analysis of the empirical material that you will collect

4.

- Plan and define steps you can do to ensure that the proposed study follows conventions regarding reliability, validity, and ethical conduct

5.

- Literature review—to get an overview of the status of knowledge and establish the significance of the proposed study

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Steps to write a research proposal

01

TITLE

The title of your proposal should be concise and clear to clearly indicate your research question.

02

ABSTRACT

Include your research question, hypothesis, methodology and findings in the abstract of your proposal.

03

INTRODUCTION

Introduction should include the purpose of research, background information significance of your study.

04

LITERATURE REVIEW

Conduct a detailed literature review to understand the topic and create a clear research question.

05

RESEARCH METHODOLOGY

Explain the method you will go for to deal with your research question in this section of your proposal.

06

DISCUSSION

Describe the potential impact and merits of your research to enhance the significance.

07

CITATION

Give references to the authors and the literature you have studied for your research.
