### Spontaneous decisions:

- I think I \_\_\_\_\_ home. It is getting dark. **(GO)**

### Making predictions and stating facts that will be true in the future:

- Over the next few years, interactive TV \_\_\_\_\_ a great impact on consumer behaviour, and advertisers \_\_\_\_\_ to approach customers in a completely new way. **(MAKE, HAVE)**

### Using \_\_\_\_\_ tense for expressing future after words like: if, when, as soon as, after.....:

- I will contact you as soon as I \_\_\_\_\_ the information. **(GET)**

### \_\_\_\_\_ - to ask if someone is willing to do sth, to make requests, promises and threats, and to offer to help:

- Hello, caller. I am afraid the line is busy. \_\_\_\_\_ ? **(you, HOLD)**
- Don't worry about the meeting. I \_\_\_\_\_ you. **(SUPPORT)**

### \_\_\_\_\_ - to express that sth/sb is refusing to do sth:

- There's sth wrong with the printer. It \_\_\_\_\_ copies in reverse order. **(PRINT)**

### Arrangements:

- What \_\_\_\_\_ on Friday afternoon? **(DO)** I \_\_\_\_\_ the accountants. **(DO, SEE)**

### Decisions and intentions:
