1. John went to live in France 5 years ago and he lives there now.

- a. He still lives in France.
- b. He lives in France yet.

2. They haven't arrived. We expect them to be here soon.

- a. They didn't arrive yet.
- b. They haven't arrived yet.

3. She's unemployed. She's been unemployed for 3 years.

- a. She still hasn't got a job.
- b. She's got a job already.

4. I've just finished eating dinner. I'm hungry.

- a. I'm hungry yet.
- b. I'm still hungry.

5. He started looking for a job yesterday. He's starting working tomorrow.

- a. He's got a job already.
- b. He's still got a job.

6. She stopped eating meat 10 years ago. Even though she likes steak she doesn't eat meat now.

- a. She doesn't still eat meat.
- b. She still doesn't eat meat.
