The marketing manager is leaving the company tomorrow.
- We went to a presentation yesterday. It was very interesting. (that)
The presentation very interesting.
- I met a woman. Her sister works for ABN. (whose)
I met ABN.
- A man is waiting in reception. He wants to see you. (who)
The man see you.
