

# GOOGLE SCHOLAR

• Google Scholar provides a simple way to broadly search for scholarly literature.

- You can search across many disciplines and sources:
  - articles, theses, books, abstracts, from academic publishers, professional societies, online repositories, universities and other web sites.

#### o PageRank

• It's Google's algorithm that assigns a numerical weighting to each element of a hyperlinked set of documents with the purpose of "measuring" its relative importance within the set.

This is the reason why some documents appear first than others.



A Boolean search uses "operators" (AND, OR, NOT)






