
Weight-teasing is a common occurrence in the lives of adolescents. Frequent weight-teasing is reported by 19% of average-weight girls and 13% of average-weight boys; much higher percentages of overweight girls (45%) and overweight boys (50%) report that they have been teased frequently about their weight [1]. Given the emphasis placed on weight and appearance in our society, this type of teasing may have serious implications for broad emotional well-being of young people—an area of substantial concern in the adolescent health field [2,3]. Relatively little is known, however, about the effects of weight-teasing on emotional well-being. Both low self-esteem and poor body image are common among adolescents [4,5], and have been linked to the development of disordered eating and depression, among other outcomes, particularly among girls [5–7]. Depression is also common: according to national Youth Risk Behavior Surveillance data, over one third of adolescent girls and one fifth of adolescent boys felt so sad or hopeless almost every day for at least 2 weeks in a row that they stopped doing usual activities, and 17% had seriously considered attempting suicide during the year preceding the survey [3]. Among college students, 11% had seriously considered attempting suicide in the previous year [8]. More




