





Rowland Pushed By Bad Times

Needs Third Term To Deal With Damage

In 1998, as he campaigned for a second term, Gov. John G. Rowland ran so the clean, clean, maybe someone else four years.

"The answer is, I can't turn back time. We've run out of time. And I believe the best way to cope," he said. In hindsight, the worst was yet to come: a scandal in the state treasurer's office, the loss of \$250 million in a controversial deal with Enron Corp. and an economic meltdown that would put a huge hole in the state budget. If Rowland wanted to quit while he was ahead,

he should have.

Now, Rowland really can't turn back time, if he wants to honor his legacy of success. He may have appeared for a second term to continue the momentum of the flow, but now he needs a third term to undo damage from the second.

In a recent interview, Rowland acknowledged that the past four years haven't been as smooth as he had hoped, and said he wants another term to see a few things through — namely, the state budget, child prostitution and three more. Those issues have hampered his ability to claim credit for reviving Connecticut's economy and restoring faith in state government.

"If I could summarize in one sentence what I hope to do, I would say it's to revitalize the economy, secure and financially sound," Rowland said. "One of the reasons I'm running is to get this economy around. It would be hard to know what there's so much."

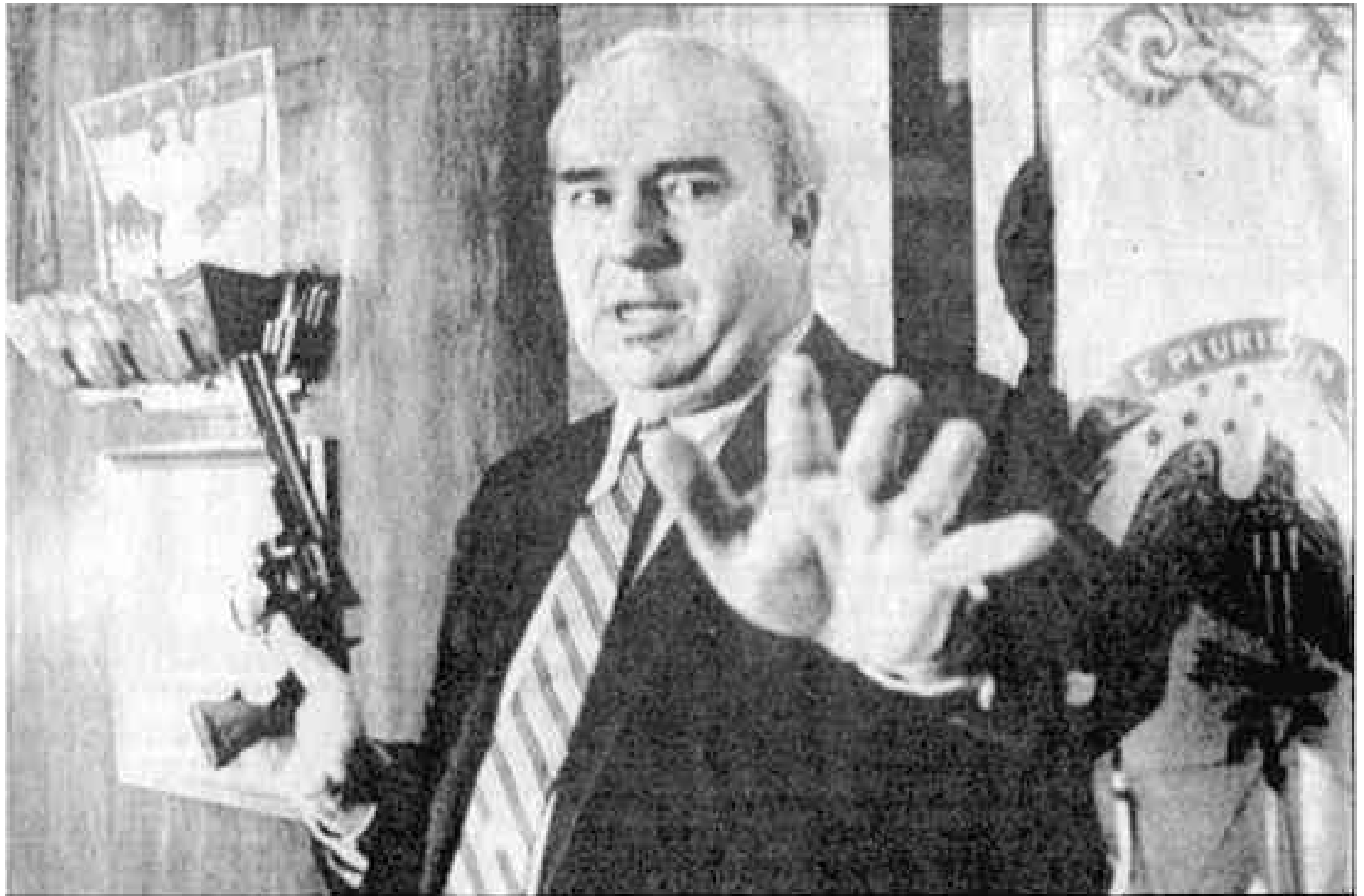

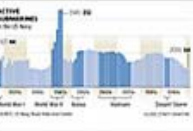


In a satellite image, a man identified as Erik Berg was beheaded in Iraq by militants claiming revenge for abuse.

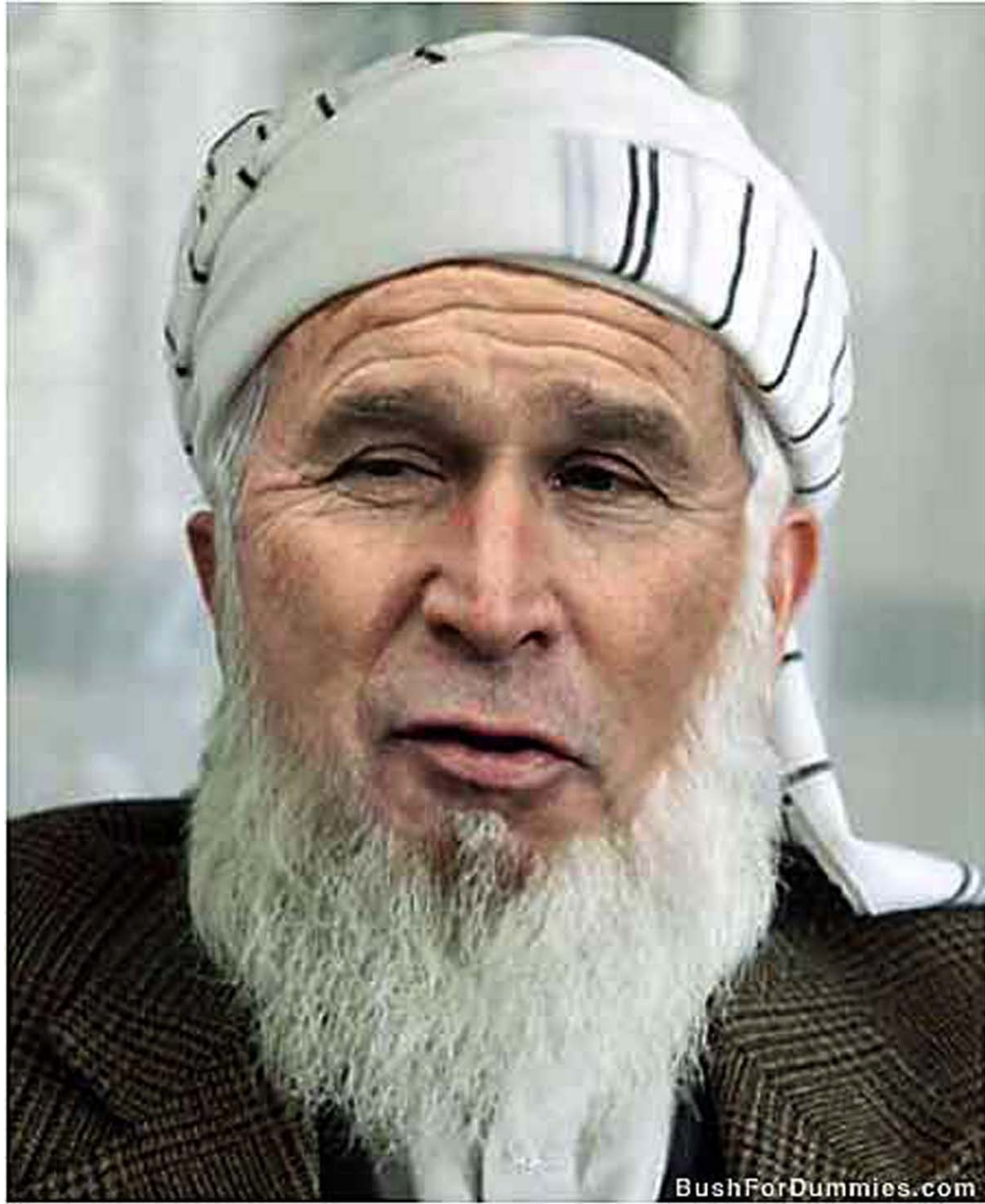

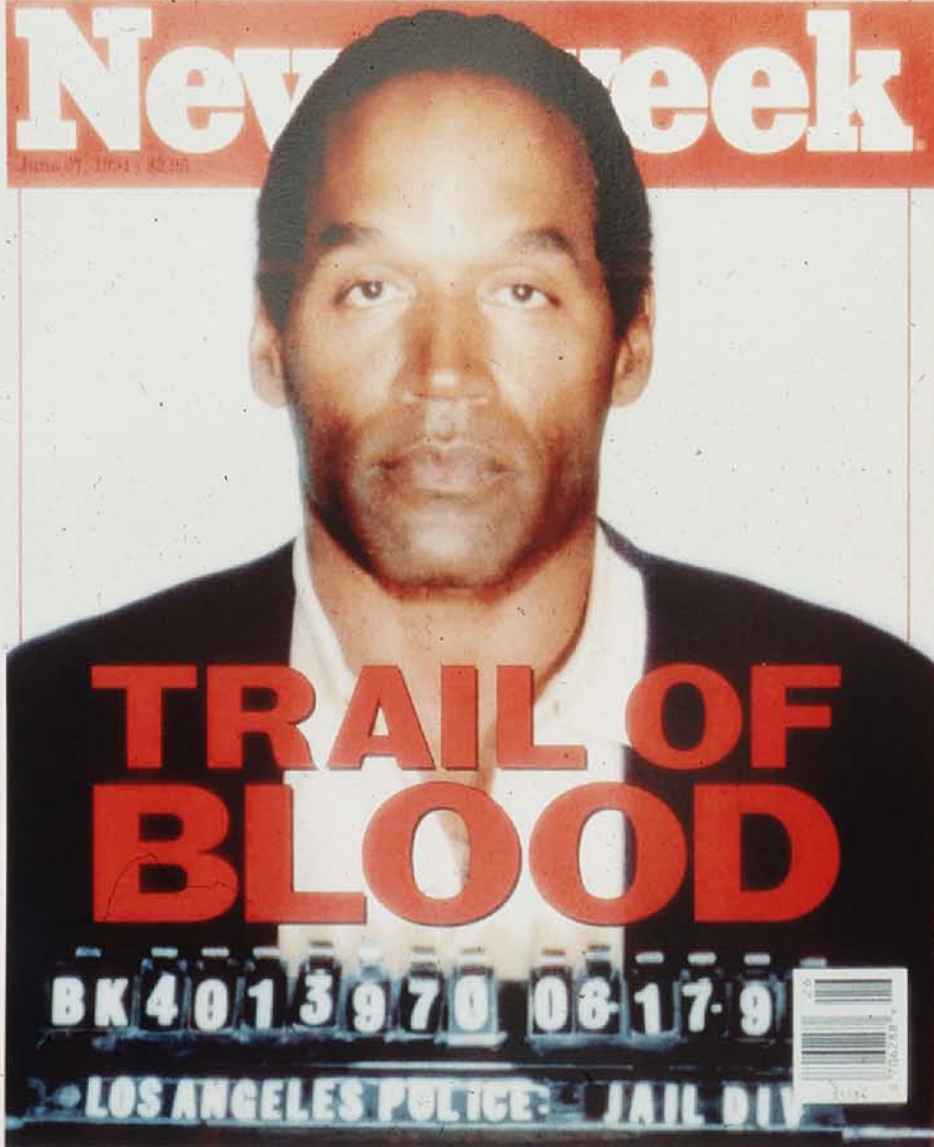
