Syllabus – spring 2019

Lecturers

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Course Description

The course discusses new developments in the EU and runs each spring semester. It is based on class discussions and presentations of various positions in the debates. The objectives of the course are to discuss topical events in the EU and improve student's argumentation and presentation skills.

Requirements of the Course

- 4 ECTS (1 class and 1 seminar per week)
- 6 short opinion papers max. 18 points
- Regularly participation max. 12 points
- Active participation in the class
- Min. 18 points required to pass the course

Position papers

Student has to produce 6 written opinion papers based on the topic of the seminar. The student can choose his/her 6 papers from weeks 2-11. Position paper should be max. 2700 characters long. It should be composed of (1) two or three discussion questions; (2) the problematics of each of these discussion questions should be shortly described (each description based on own opinion should have approx. 500 characters). Papers must be submitted **at least one day (24 hours)** before concerned lesson to teaching lecturer via Homework Folders in the Information System.
