

WHY SHOULD I TAKE THIS COURSE?



The impact of Israel on regional and international politics is disproportional to its geographical size and demographic base => relevant topic



Interdisciplinary and comprehensive course => history, politics, international relations



Extensive introduction to Israeli history and nation building

National identity as a product of subcultures, Zionism and post-Zionism

The relationship between Religion & state: political and social implications

The Arab/Israeli and Israeli/Palestinian conflicts (and the way they influence Israeli politics and society)

- STUDENTS ARE EXPECTED TO PAY ATTENTION TO NEWS CONCERNING ISRAELI
 SOCIETY AND POLITICS DURING THE COURSE
- STUDENTS WILL BASE THEIR ESSAYS ON ONE NEWS ARTICLE/COMMENTARY
 PUBLISHED IN ENGLISH DURING THE COURSE
- STUDENTS WILL WRITE A SHORT ANALYSIS, CRITIC OR RESPONSE TO THE ARTICLE/COMMENTARY

MID-TERM ESSAYS

- SUGGESTED MEDIA OUTLETS ARE FOUND IN THE SYLLABUS
- STUDENTS ARE WELCOME TO PURSUE OTHER SOURCES (ONLINE/OFFLINE)
- COMMENTARIES CHOSEN FOR THE PURPOSE OF THE MID-TERM ESSAY SHOULD SPECIFICALLY RELATE TO ISRAELI POLITICS AND SOCIETY (NOT ISRAELI ECONOMY, ART, WEATHER, START-UPS, SPORT, ETC.).

Essays will include:

Basic info concerning the media outlet (ownership, political orientation...)

Introduction of the topic and further relevant information

Original input
