In the classes: If you learn hard, you will pass the exam with flying colours.

You will pass the exam with flying colours if you learn hard.

At the test: If you worked hard, you would pass the exam with flying colours.

You would pass the exam with flying colours if you worked hard.

If SUBJECT had VERBed ..., SUBJECT would HAVE VERBed...

After a failed exam: If you had worked hard, you would have passed the exam...

You would have passed the exam if you had worked hard...
