Analysis or ofred

- shows us the issue
- Proves that there is an issue
- Brings out who is to blame
- Argues that there is an issue

Whats the difference!

- one is longer, the other one is shorter
- op-pieces are strongly argumented, built usually in the same way
- analysis has more flexibility

What's the similarity!

- both argue something, both emphasise something
- both have center-thesis, a focus point
- both have facts in them

The necessary elements for open

- You need to have an opinion
- Introduction, opening the topic
- Your center thesis is presented in the intro!
- 1st argument
- 2nd argument
- 3rd argument
- Outro: reframe bring it back to the start

The necessary elements for analysis

- You need to have an opinion!
- A bit like an essay
- Introduction, opening the topic
- You present the facts and build the narrative around that
- It is longer and explanatory you open what the facts mean

What first what's your focus!

- What is the point you want to make?
- What paves the way to your story?
- Our story is about...

What first!

- Is your center thesis strong enough?
- Is it too wide? Too narrow?
- How can you prove your point?

What is second!

- Arguments
- How to build an argument?
- It starts with your claim, then you prove it and then you summarise.

What is second! ARGUMENTS!

OP-PIECES AND ANALYSIS

CLAIM

We should legalise cannabis

PROOF

Because I think it is okay

SUMMARY

Therefore, the government should act right away.

What is second! Arguments!

OP-PIECES AND ANALYSIS

CLAIM

We should legalise cannabis

PROOF

Because the university of XYZ brought out in their latest research the benefits of cannabis overpowering the possible negatives.

SUMMARY

Although studies go on, it is time to talk about legalising.

Third! Intro and outro.

OP-PIECES AND ANALYSIS

- I recommend to frame it: the intro is connected outro.
- You need to be very short in explaining what is your story about and what WAS your story about
- Example of framing:

fairytales

Teachers are the salt of the earth...

Earth needs its salt.

Fourth! Heading!

- It can be whatever you like
- It has to be similar to the topic you are covering
- It has to encourage to read!

Fifth

- What are you going to use as your proof? What documents? What databases?
- If you want to make bigger claims, the bigger your proof has to be!

The length! OP-PIECES AND ANALYSIS

- Opinion pieces up to 4000 characters with spaces and at least two subheadings
- Analysis up to 8000 characters (w spaces), at least four subheadings, some graphs
