Non-rationalist explanation: grievances, frustration

- Rationalist explanations: individual and collective incentives
 - Private benefits of participation, social pressure and social sanctions

Rational choice approach to violence

- Mass violence is not an act of barbarism but a war strategy
- Central question: Why do incumbents or insurgents kill civilians?
- Violence affects civilian support during war
- Some reasons: to find infiltrated enemies and prevent civilian defection, ...others?

Selective vs. indiscriminate violence

- Selective (discriminant) violence: when individuals are targeted based on personalized information about their actions;
- Indiscriminate violence: when individuals are targeted solely on the basis of their membership in a group perceived to be connected with the opposition and irrespective of their individual actions
- Both aim to generate compliance via deterrence (i.e., to control the population)

A theory of selective violence

- Rebels and gov. forces often don't have full control over the territory
- Territorial control requires collaboration of civilians
- Most prefer to collaborate with the side that best guarantees their survival rather than defect by helping the rival.
- Collaboration is uncertain in areas of fragmented sovereignty where both sides are present.

A theory of selective violence (cont.)

- Selective violence is used to consolidate control, but it requires information
- Selective violence is the result of transactions between political actors and individuals: it is jointly produced by them.

Indiscriminate violence

- If indiscriminate violence is counterproductive in civil war, why does it occur so often?
- Indiscriminate violence as a result of lack of information
- Indiscriminate violence is cheaper than selective violence (a reason for its emergence)
- What are the reasons for its perseverance?
