# Unless

- Meaning: if not
- Unless children are with their parents, they cannot swim in the pool.
- You can go to the cinema unless you have not done your homework.

# As long as

- Meaning: if only, if
- As long as children are with their parents, they can swim in the pool
- You can go to the cinema as long as you have done your homework.

# Provided/Provided that/ Providing

- Meaning: if only, if – same as: as long as
- All form of provided have the same meaning
- Provided that children are with their parents, they can swim in the pool
- You can go to the cinema providing that you have done your homework.

# In case, In case of

- Meaning: In case – because maybe
- Take an umbrella in case it rains.
- Meaning: in case of–if something is happening
- In case of fire, call the firefighters

# If only/I wish

- Meaning: changes with the following tense:
- I wish I was eating less.
  - - right now, current situation, at dinner
- If only I had eaten less.
  - - when I was a child for example
- I wish I would eat less.
  - - habit
