

Switzerland and the EU



- Landlocked alpine country in Western Europe
- 41,285 square km (half the size of Austria)
- Bern: Administrative capita, Lausanne: judicial center
- Zurich: Major metropolitan, Geneva: Headquarters of many N/GOs, including the UN
- Heidi- J. Spyri, 1881
- Rich, neutral, stable







- Switzerland borders five countries: Italy, France, Germany, Austria, Liechtenstein
- Territory: 35.9% agricultural land, 31.3% forests & woodlands, 7.5% settlements + urban areas, trade, industry, transport, etc.
 - Glaciers cover roughly 3% of Switzerland's surface area:
 receded over time
- Alphs: Greatest mountain range system of Europe, stretching from Austria to France
- Switzerland has around 1,500 lakes





- Originated in the Confoederatio Helvetica (Swiss Confederation, 1291)
- 1848: a new constitution adopted => Switzerland was formed
- Since mid 19th century: relative domestic tranquility + organization remained essentially the same:
 - Union of more than 3k municipalities situated in 26 cantons: Units of local government
 - Three cantons (Unterwalden, Basel, Appenzell) are divided into demi (half) cantons, function as full cantons



The Swiss Cantons




- Federalism gives the Cantons political autonomy: Self-govern + influence in federal decision-making
- Constitutional amendments require a majority of Cantons => Protects small, rural Cantons
 - Yet, federalism only protects minorities constituting a political majority in a canton
- The 'capital of direct democracy': citizens can participate at every level of politics (including referenda + public initiatives)
 - Swiss taxes are rather low by European standards
 - Political decision making tends to be slow



Population Centers =>

- 8.65 million residents (2020)
- **Zürich**: Largest metropolitan
- Bern: Admin capital
- Basel, Geneva, Lucerne,
 Lausanne, Lugano, Montreux
 and St. Gallen




Religion =>

- Freedom of religion: Constitutional right
- Predominantly Christian country (Roman Catholics > Protestants: Reformed Evangelists)
 - Other Christian denominations: 6%, largest group: Orthodox Church

Current trends:

- Number of people with no religious affiliation has gone up (1% in 1970, 24% in 2017)
- Diversification of the religious landscape: >5% Muslims, <1% Jewish</p>

3 official: German, French, Italian

 German spoken in Germany and Austria is NOT the same as Swiss-German

English is widely spoken



- Number of foreigners in Switzerland increased at a faster rate than the number of Swiss natives
 - Positive net migration responsible for population growth




- More than 2.1 million foreigners reside in Switzerland (24.5% of the total population)
 - The majority of foreigners residing permanently in Switzerland (68%) are European (EU/EFTA)
- Italian, German, Portuguese and French nationals comprise the majority of foreigners from an EU/EFTA member state
- Children born to foreign citizens in Switzerland do NOT immediately receive citizenship

The Minaret Controversy

- Construction of minarets in Switzerland has been subject to legal & political controversy
- Constitutional amendment banning the construction of new minarets was approved by 57.5% (2009)

4/26 cantonsopposed the initiative








Send Criminal Foreigners Home







- Unique blend of federalism + direct democracy
- Major economic power:
 - Financial services
 - High-quality, specialized manufactures of items (e.g., clocks)
 - specialty foodstuffs (e.g., Emmentaler cheese)
- Fondu, army knife
- Among the world's highest standards of living









Economy


- Exports of goods and services account for nearly two-thirds of the country's GDP
 - Main exports => Machinery & equipment, chemical-pharmaceutical products, watches, textiles
 - Main imports => Manufactured goods, motor vehicles, chemical products, raw materials, food, vegetable oils, fuel
- Over 99% of Swiss firms are small + medium-sized enterprises
- Public debt is low, competitive tax system + service sector make Switzerland an attractive location for companies, including multinational corporations



Economy



- Export-oriented economy
 - The EU is Switzerland's main trading partner, accounting for two-thirds of its total foreign trade
- Switzerland's largest
 economic
 partners by volume of trade (2018)



Neutrality



- Neutrality: Cornerstone of Swiss foreign policy
 - Formally recognised in 1815 (Congress of Vienna), 1907 (Hague Convention)
 - No external armed conflicts/assistance, NOT a member of any military alliances
- Post Cold War-
 - Switzerland took part in economic sanctions against Iraq (first Gulf War in 1991)
 - 1996: joined NATO's Partnership for Peace programme
 - 1999: Sent unarmed volunteers to support peacekeeping efforts in Kosovo
 - 2002: Joined the UN
- Deeply engrained in Switzerland's collective psyche, enjoys wide popular support,
 meant to secure internal cohesion

Neutrality



- Neutrality doesn't mean NO military
 - Conscription for men
- Soldiers + reserves keep their arms at home
- Guns are part of the Swiss heritage
 - 2011: Rejected an initiative to ban army-issued guns at home,
 central gun registry + strict licensing system for the use of firearm
- Cave-like constructions in mountains for military purposes: hold arms,
 supplies, fighter jets





















Switzerland and the EU



- The European Free Trade Association (EFTA), intergovernmental organisation (1960)
 - Promotion of free trade + economic integration between its Member States within Europe and globally
 - EFTA does NOT:
 - Envision political integration
 - Issue legislation
 - Establishes a customs union




EFTA members maintain the full right to enter bilateral, third-country arrangements

Switzerland and the EU



- The European Economic Area (EEA, 1994):
 - Extend the Internal Market of the EU to EFTA States => create a homogeneous European Economic Area
- Switzerland voted 'No' to joining the
 EEA (referendum in 1992)
 - Uninterested in ceding sovereignty
 - Protect direct democracy + local industries from foreign competition



Switzerland and the EU



- Policy of signing bilateral agreements with the EU rather than joining it
 - Bilaterals I (1999)
 - Continuous updates to EFTA (2001-)
 - Bilaterals II (2004) ...
- Partial Integration into the single market
- Policy of signing bilateral agreements with the EU rather than joining it
