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Clarification

- A literature-review thesis
 - Number of articles on the topic: 30+, ideally 40-50
 - depends on the topic
 - My personal recommendation (after consulting with colleagues), no formal rule
- The question of using "I think..."
 - Depends on the context. Use it when it enhances your writing (makes it simpler, easier to read)
 - Also OK to say "This thesis shows that...," "Based the analysis of XY data, this thesis argues...."
 - Definitely allowed (I checked with colleagues at the dept.)

Research paper

- Addresses a gap in scientific knowledge
 - tells us something we don't know from the literature
 - in a BA thesis, this contribution can be small
- Presents an argument based on empirical analysis
 - the argument speaks to existing research
- May present a new concept or theory
 - presenting a new theory may be a bit too challenging at BA level

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Structure of a research paper

- 1. Introduction
 - State the topic, defend its relevance, state your research question
 - Summarize what is known about the topic and what gap in knowledge you are addressing
 - Briefly summarize your findings and state your argument
 - argument = a statement based on empirical results that ties the results to theories
 - the argument makes the results relevant outside the cases you studied
 - May describe the structure of the chapters

Structure of a research paper

- 2. Literature review/ Theoretical part
 - Review literature
 - What answers to your research question does the literature provide?
 - Say what is missing/wrong in the literature
 - plus emphasize that you are going to address it (&how)
 - State the expectations for your analysis, supported by arguments derived from literature or reasoned arguments
 - Expectations stated in the form of hypotheses (sometimes research questions)
 - Each hypothesis should have a theoretical explanation

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Structure of a research paper

- 3. Data and variables
 - Describe your data
 - what, where from, ...
 - Why these data are suitable
 - Describe variables
 - describe and defend your choices on conceptualization (may already appear in theoretical part) and operationalization
- 4. Analysis
 - Identify the type of analysis and defend your choice
 - Present your results, tie them back to hypotheses
 - Keep the hypotheses in mind, avoid tangents
 - Could be more than 1 chapter

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Structure of a research paper

- 5. Conclusion
 - Summary: What& why, findings, argument
 - Discussion of the weaknesses
 - Argument's implications
 - Often includes suggestions for future research

 - · Good as a check list
 - Ideal for peer feedback

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Extended position paper

- Adopts and presents an argumentative stance in response to a position held by another author
 - similar to a research paper but more focused on challenging an argument
 - not necessarily filling a gap in knowledge

Structure of a position paper

- Similar to a research paper, plus the following:
 - Emphasizes the challenged thesis
 - No hypotheses, "just" a defended counter-thesis
 - Data analysis has less space&importance than in a research paper
 - discussion of arguments in existing literature as a source of evidence plays an important role
 - The conclusion evaluates the strength of provided counter-argument
 - In addition to summarizing your counter-argument
