- Research done in 1937.
- Published 1964.

Research goal

- To understand differences in family life in different parts of the country experiencing various degrees of economic development and modernization
- From modernized industrial north to traditional south

Key idea

- Family relations in Yugoslavia are determined by the level of modernization (duration of cultural patterns)
-
- „in some parts it seemed as if the way of life remained unchanged for a thousand years, whereas in others it was adapted to the values of Western Europe” (str. 23)

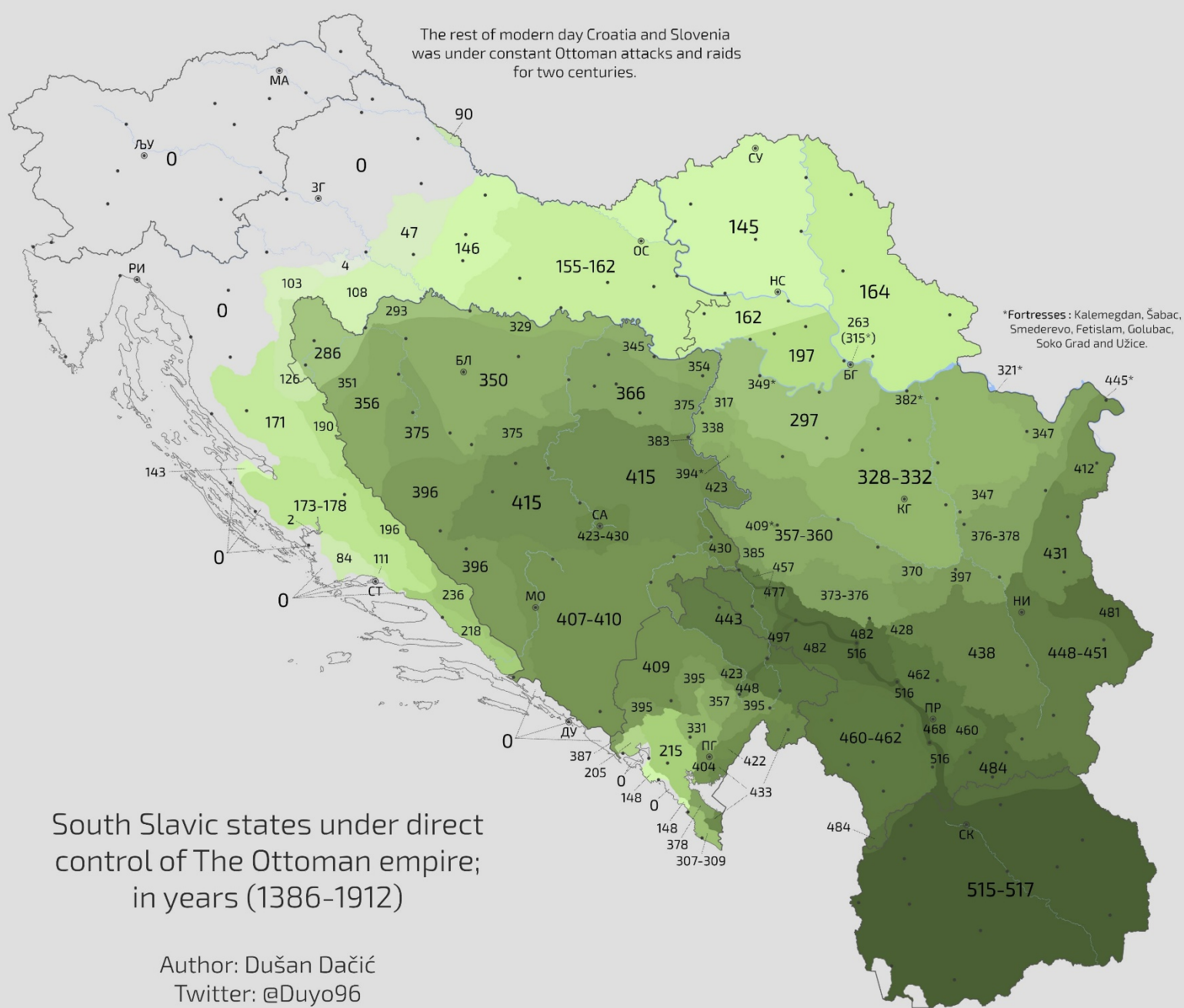

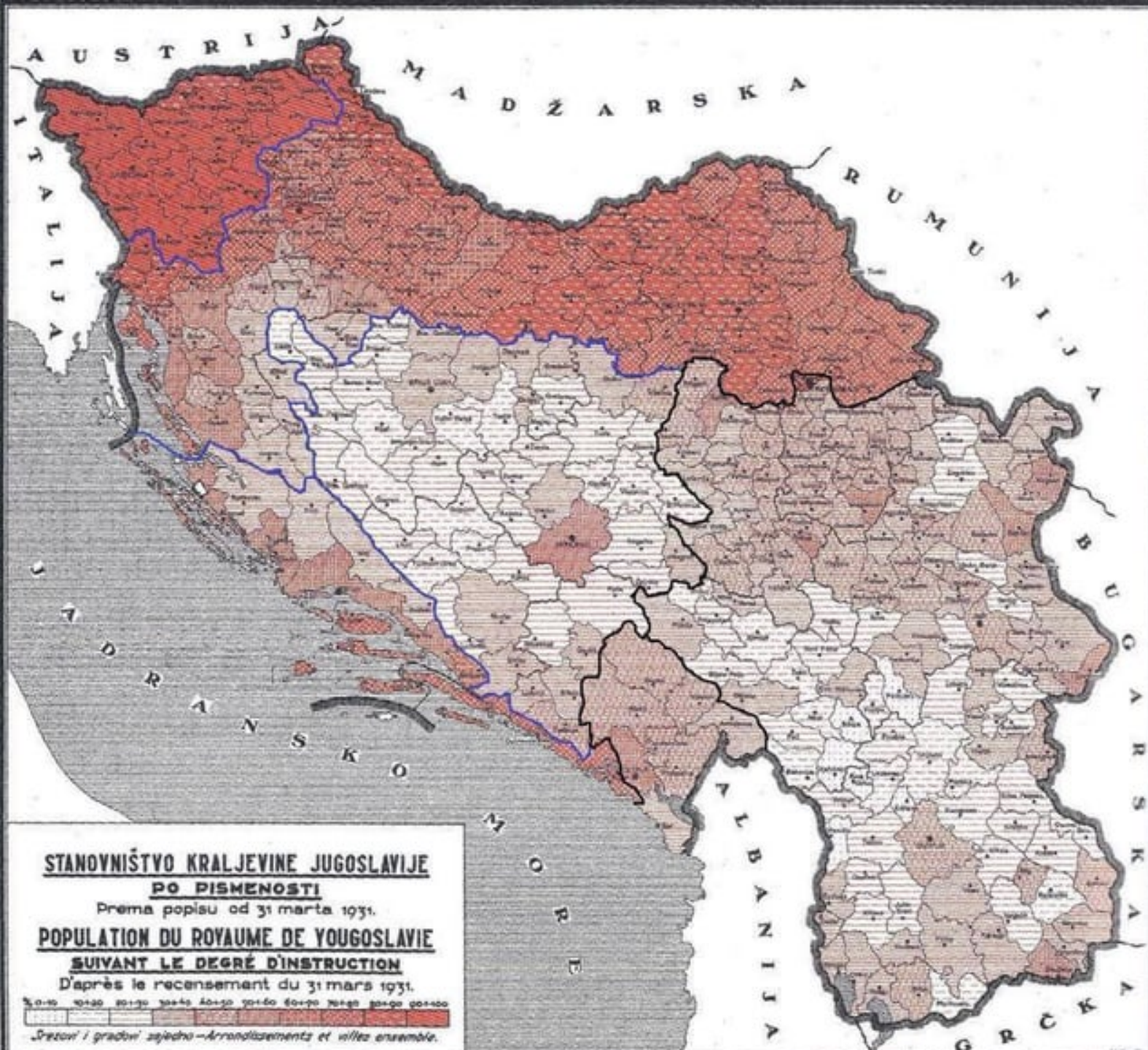




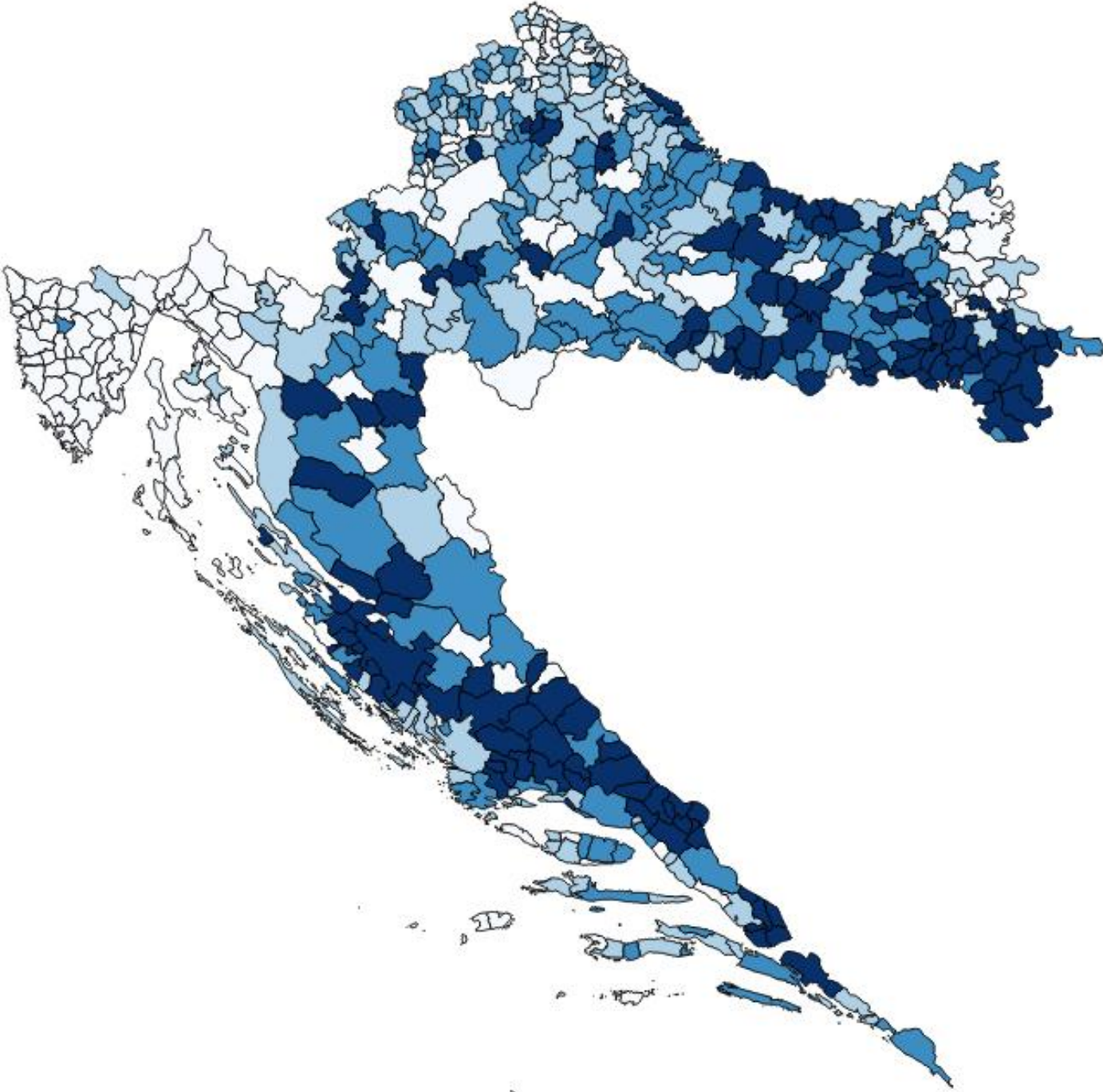
- The Ottoman rule (white spaces parts of either Habsburg monarchy, Venetian Stato da mar and the small territory of Dubrovnik republic).
