












The Nature/Essence of the EU

- EU is a supranational organization
- superior, "above" the Member States
- Member States VOLUNTARILY TRANSFERRED CERTAIN

POWERS TO THE EU IN SPECIFIC AREAS

- EU exercise authority on their behalf in certain areas/fields EU can create laws and rules
- EU does not have authority in some areas MS are free to set their own laws and rules




inequality among Member States
