I was down in the Basement when I heard a female voice (in distress) & a pounding on my Back door. When I opened it, I saw a young nude woman with Blood on her hands. Almost out of breath, she told me she had just been attacked. I quickly covered her with a blanket that was handy, checked to make sure her assailant wasn't following her; then I called 911. I tried to calm her - engaged her in a conversation - she told me: she was our neighbor (I didn't recognize her at first), MARLY a female "friend" of her boy friend had entered her condo while she was asleep (she wasn't sure her door was locked) and began cutting; hers she asked me to call her boyfriend Steve at work. I finally figured out the correct number and told Steve briefly what had happened. Then the Police arrived Albert Manis

AT THAT TIME MARLY WAS ASLEEP IN BED. I WENT
FIRST TO THE U-HAUL STORAGE AREA ON SOUTH STATE
STREET. I LEFT THERE AT @ 8:00 AM AND WENT
DIRECTLY TO WORK. (EXPRESSION DESIGN. 2261
W. LIBERTY, ANN ARBOR, MI 747-7444). I ARRIVED
THERE AT 8:17 AM. I WAS THERE AT WORK WHEN
A NEIGHBOR CALLED. MY BOSS ANSWERED THE PHONE
FIRST BUT INADVERTENTLY CUT THE CALLER OFF.
WHEN THEY CALLED BACK, I ANSWERED. I WAS TOLD
BY THE NEIGHBOR "MARLY HAS BEEN INJURED. SHE
NEEDS YOU TO COME HOME." I LEFT WORK IMMEDIATELY
AND RETURNED HOME TO FIND POLICE ON THE SCENE
AS WELL AS AN AMBULANCE.

03 NATURE Aggravated/Felonious Assault investigation

04 INFORMATION On 7/30, I, Det. Grimes, was dispatched to a crime

05 scene at 39 Breckland Drive, Ann Arbor, Michigan, to assist Det.

06 Sgt. McReil with scene processing. Officer Fisk, Det. Sgt.

07 McReil and Sgt. Lyter were on the scene upon my arrival. Officer

08 Fisk completed interviews, attempted to contact neighbors and

09 canvassed the area for weapons. Det. Sgt. McReil, Sgt. Lyter and

10 I processed the scene with the victims' live-in boyfriend,

11 Subject/ Keting, present.

12 SCENE The scene was located at a condominium complex consisting of

13 four units per building. The incident occurred in the last unit on

14 the south end of the building. The unit had four points of entry; a

15 door attached to the garage, a side door at the extreme south end of

16 the building, a balcony with a sliding glass door and a basement patio

17 with a sliding glass door. All doors were secured with the exception

18 of the balcony door and the side door located on the end of the

19 building. Per Officer Fisk's original report, and contact with the

20 victim, the victim had escaped her attacker through the side door. ★

21 Observations of the side door revealed a small amount of blood on the

22 exterior and a large amount of smeared blood on the interior, just

23 above the doorknob.

24 Inside the unit, clumps of blood soaked hair were lying on

25 the floor in the living room near the front door and small amounts of

26 hair were in an adjoining hallway. The same hallway wall was smeared

27 with blood stains. The hallway led to a bedroom. On the bed, blood

03 stained blankets were piled at the end of the mattress and the lower

04 portion of the sheets were bloodstained. Carpet beside the bed, and

05 at the end of the bed, was heavily soiled with blood stains and more

06 strands of bloody hair were found. Checks of all rooms in the unit

07 revealed no signs of the weapons used.

08 PHOTOGRAPHS The scene was photographed by Det. Sgt. McRELL using

09 a Polaroid Spectra System instant camera. A total of nine pictures

10 were taken of the scene.

11 SEARCH/EVIDENCE A search of the apartment for weapons was

12 unsuccessful. I, Det. GRIMES, collected the hair samples and

13 preserved them as evidence in plain manila envelopes marked with the

14 date and time of collection. (Note: The hair appeared cut)

15 A handwritten letter from Victim/Shoeman to Subject/

16 Keting was discovered on the dining room table. The letter

17 complained of Subject, Keting's relationship with Suspect/Nosal.

18 It was taken as possible evidence.

19 All bedding was also retained, as were a pair of work boots

20 and a blue baseball cap, which were located on the bedroom floor.

21 Subject/Keting indicated they were suspicious because they did not

22 belong to him or Victim/Shoeman. The baseball cap had LADDOK

23 printed in white letters on the crown. The boots were mens', size 9

24 1/2 "Dickies". They were tan w/green lining and appeared/smelled

25 brand new. No tags were attached but manufacturer's stickers were

26 still fastened to the interior lining and a bottom sole. A small

27 amount of cut grass was clumped in the track of the bottom of the

04 Items were photographed before collection and removal. I

05 transported and logged all items into the PTPD Property Room as

06 evidence. See attached property card.

07 WEAPON Unknown edged instrument

08 LATENT PRINTS None detected

09 ADDITIONAL INFORMATION While on scene, Subject/ *Keating*

10 indicated that Suspect/ *Nosal's* attack on Victim/ *Shoeman* was

11 improbable and he was concerned the victim's injuries may have been

12 self-inflicted and the incident fabricated. He noted the victim had

13 attempted suicide once in the past over the loss of a boyfriend. He

14 indicated that the victim is his live-in girlfriend but they maintain

15 an open relationship (seeing and sleeping with others) and that

16 Suspect, *Nosal* was his lover.

17 No current means to verify Subject/ *Keating's* suspicions.

18 AREA BROADCAST Based on the victim's identification of her

19 attacker, local and Lansing area police were issued a BOL, via LEIN,

20 for Suspect/ *Nosal*. The message indicated the nature of the offense

21 and that probable cause existed to make an arrest.

22 INVESTIGATION Upon completion of scene processing, Univ. of Mich.

23 Hospital was contacted to request an interview with Victim/

24 *Shoeman*. However, hospital staff stated that, due to surgery and

25 recovery time, she would be unavailable until the mid-afternoon of

26 7/30/ (Note: They indicated a hospital security guard had

27 interviewed Victim/ *Shoeman* prior to her surgery.)

INTERVIEW W/SECURITY The security guard was identified as Scott

04

Richard Prepp W/M, 1-25-84. Contact was immediately made with subject

05

Prepp who indicated he had spoken with Victim/Shoeman prior to her

06

surgery. He recalled that Victim/Shoeman had stated she was laying

07

in her bed and Suspect/Nosal had come in with a knife and tried to

08

cut her. He indicated that Victim/Shoeman said she fought

09

Suspect/Nosal off and got the knife away but that Suspect/Nosal

10

picked up a wrench and hit her over the head. Subject Prepp thought

11

Victim/Shoeman said she blacked out. However, later contacts with

12

Victim/Shoeman's doctors ,revealed that, in questioning her upon

13

her arrival in the emergency room, she had stated she did not black

14

out.
