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03 drove to the Mich. State Univ. intramural center to exercise. She

04 recalled that a bar code computer check of her ID card was made prior

05 to entering the facility. Suspect/Nosal stated that she was jogging

06 at the facility from 10:00 AM to 10:40 AM. Suspect/Nosal stated

07 that, after working out, she drove to the Mich. State Univ. Dept of

08 Public Safety to clear up a parking ticket she had received. She

09 indicated that she was issued a temporary parking permit and

10 remembered being helped by a Hispanic female clerk. Suspect/Nosal

11 said that she left the Police Department at approximately 10:50 AM and

12 then drove to the Plant and Soil Science building where she has a

13 lab. At the lab, she met with her faculty advisor, Karen Wolky, and

14 discussed the morning's collection. Suspect/Nosal stated that she

15 worked until 12:00 PM and then went home. Suspect/Nosal recalled

16 that, upon arriving home, she had received a telephone message from

17 her roommate, Jean Ayers, who was staying with a boyfriend in Ann

18 Arbor. Suspect/Nosal said she called Subject Ayers but the call was

19 interrupted by Subject/Wolky via call waiting. She stated that

20 Subject/Wolky told her the Dewitt Police Department needed her to

21 contact them. Suspect/Nosal said she completed the telephone

22 conversation with Ayers who told her that Subject/Keting had

23 called looking for her (Nosal). Suspect/Nosal also said that

24 Subject, Ayers told her Victim/Shoeman had been attacked and had

25 said she (Nosal) did it. Suspect/Nosal said that she was shocked

26 and didn't know what to do. She said she called the Dewitt Police

27 Department which directed her to contact the Pittsfield Police

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03 Department. Subsequently, she contacted PTPD and responded to a

04 request for an interview.

05 suspect/Nosal discussed her relationship with Victim/

06 Shoeman and Subject/Keting, indicating that they met through a

07 Medieval Renaissance Organization. She said Victim/Shoeman is a

08 friend who she met several months ago when she began dating Subject/

09 Keting. suspect/Nosal indicated that, when she and Subject/

10 Keting first met, he was dating and living with Victim/Shoeman

11 and that he continued do so after they began dating. suspect/ Nosal

12 stated that she has had a sexual relationship with both Subject: Keting and Victim/Shoeman and has engaged in several

13 "threesomes". She indicated this was not the first time she had

14 multiple sex partners but that it was the first time that she had ever

15 "connected with both people". She stated "We all knew when it was

16 over I was the one gone". suspect/ Nosal said she met with

17 subject/Keting on a regular basis and that their relationship was

18 primarily sexual. She stated she did not want a serious relationship

19 with subject/Keting and that he was committed to Victim/

20 Shoeman. suspect/Nosal said that Subject/Keting only filled

21 a sexual need at this point in her life because she was sick of being

22 alone. She said she had been to Victim/Shoeman's and

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04 Subject/ Keting's house on many occasions and she would spend

05 nights or week-ends. Suspect/ Nosal stated that she had no conflict

06 with Victim/ Shoeman over her relationship with Subject/

07 Keting . However, she admitted that she had talked to Subject/

08 Keting about becoming his primary girlfriend and related that

09 their relationship had gotten stronger. Suspect/ Nosal said she

10 cared about him but could tell he would never leave Victim/ Shoeman.

11 Suspect/ Nosal stated that she had no idea why Victim/

12 Shoeman would accuse her of the stabbing. She said Victim/

13 Shoeman had a history of mental problems and was dependant on

14 Subject/ Keting ; but she had never presented herself as a threat to

15 Victim/ Shoeman's relationship with Subject/ Keting . Suspect/

16 Nosal stated, "If she said I did this she is lying". She recalled

17 that several weeks earlier, at a medieval camping event, Victim/

18 Shoeman was upset because Subject/ Keting . was supposed to sleep

19 in her tent but, instead, fell asleep with Suspect/ Nosal . She said

20 the camping event was the last time she had seen Victim/ Shoeman and

21 thinks Victim/ Shoeman may have been irritated by the incident.

22 However, suspect/ Nosal said she could never hurt Victim/ Shoeman

23 and explained that she had been raped, understood that type of violent

24 situation and could never hurt anyone.

25 Suspect/ Nosal was unable to provide other possible

26 suspects. She speculated that Victim/ Shoeman "did it to herself"

27 and blamed her (Nosal.) because she was "jealous of or threatened by"

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03 suspect/Nosal's relationship with subject/Keting

04 suspect/Nosal stated that she was not trying to steal

05 subject/Keting away because he loves victim/Shoeman. She said

06 she doesn't know why subject/Keting sleeps with her but thinks he

07 has a fear of commitment. suspect/Nosal admitted that she loves

08 subject/Keting but knows their relationship is not permanent. She

09 indicated she was "Just looking for a fling and had no delusions that

10 he was going to be with me".

11 suspect/Nosal admitted that she planned to be in Ann Arbor

12 on 7/30/. She said she had planned to leave East Lansing after

13 work, at approx. 5:00 PM. but stated that she had no plans to see

14 subject/Keting or victim/Shoeman during the trip. She admitted

15 that she had called on Monday, 7-29-, to ask subject/Keting if

16 he wanted to get together; but he could not because of prior

17 commitments. She stated that, during the trip, she had planned to

18 visit with other friends in the area; Melody .. Zody-Pline until 8:00

19 PM and then subject/Ayers for dinner. suspect/Nosal stated that,

20 until her arrival at : PD, she had not been in the Ann Arbor area or

21 near victim/Shoeman's condominium on 7-30-. Also,

22 suspect/Nosal stated she had no key to the condominium and related

23 that she had no further knowledge of the attack on victim/Shoeman.

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03 Suspect/*Nosal* allowed herself to be photographed and have

04 her fingernails, hair, arms and face checked for signs of injury.

05 None were observed. She allowed a hair sample to be taken from her

06 and a consent search of her vehicle. Also, Suspect/*Nosal* consented

07 to a polygraph exam which was scheduled for Wednesday, 7/31/.

08 I conducted the search of Suspect/*Nosal*'s vehicle. No

09 weapons and signs of blood or other evidence were observed or

10 recovered. Suspect/*Nosal* was released pending an interview with

11 Victim/ *Shoeman* and further investigation.

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14 STATUS/DISPOSITION Active

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03 NATURE Aggravated/Felonious Assault investigation

04 INTERVIEW W/VICTIM Shoeman. At 1800 hours on 7/30/ I, Det.

05 Grimes:, interviewed victim/Shoeman at the Univ. of Michigan

06 Hospital, Trauma Burn Center, in room 5109 where she was kept for

07 recovery after surgery. Victim/Shoeman was awake and alert. Her

08 wounds were covered by a neck collar and were not visible. Medical

09 records were not available at this time.

10 Victim/Shoeman was able to recall the incident without

11 difficulty. She stated that she was asleep on her stomach in bed,

12 felt "scratching" on her neck and realized that someone was attacking

13 her. Victim/ Shoeman stated that she wrestled around and realized

14 that her attacker was Carol Nosal. She stated that Suspect/ Nosal

15 had "a little sickle" and was slashing at her face, throat and neck.

16 She said she pushed Suspect/ Nosal 's hands away and is positive that

17 it was Suspect/ Nosal. because she "looked right into her face".

18 Victim/ Shoeman described Suspect/ Nosal 's appearance stating; she

19 wore jeans, a plain dark navy or burgundy sweat shirt, yellow leather

20 work gloves and wore her hair in a pony tail. Victim/ Shoeman

21 stated that she begged Suspect/ Nosal not to kill her and

22 Suspect/ Nosal stopped the attack for a second, stated "Okay", and

23 then began to attack her again. Victim/ Shoeman stated that she

24 recognized Suspect/ Nosal 's voice and her smell. Victim/ Shoeman

25 stated that she got to her feet and fought with Suspect/ Nosal.. She

26 said that she managed to get the knife away and ran for the previously

27 noted side door. Victim/ Shoeman stated that Suspect/ Nosal tried

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03 to block the door, holding it shut with her body and began to hit

04 Victim/ Shoeman in the head with something. She said she later

05 realized that she had been hit with "a long pipe wrench with a red

06 handle". Victim/ Shoeman stated that she struggled with Suspect/

07 Nosal and was able to get the door open. She said that she was able

08 to get outside and began screaming for help. She recalled that she

09 kept running and went to a neighbor's house because the garage door

10 was open.

11 Victim/ Shoeman did not recall seeing Suspect/ Nosal's

12 vehicle in the area when she ran outside. Victim/ Shoeman stated

13 that she never passed out and was conscious the entire time.

14 Victim/ Shoeman did not know what happened to the knife she had

15 pulled away from Suspect/ Nosal. Victim/ Shoeman indicated that

16 she did not use the knife against Suspect/ Nosal while they fought

17 against the door. She said she did not wish to hurt Suspect/ Nosal

18 and was only trying to get away. She did recall that, when she ran

19 into the living room, the side door was open a crack.

20 Victim/ Shoeman indicated that it is not unusual for that door to be

21 left unlocked and believed Suspect/ Nosal had entered through it.

22 Asked if her attacker was wearing anything on his/her head,

23 Victim/ Shoeman stated that she thought Suspect/ Nosal was wearing

24 a plain dark blue baseball cap. Note, however, subject/ Keting had

25 mentioned the cap and work boots during an earlier visit to the

26 hospital. Victim/ Shoeman stated that the boots were not

27 subject/ Keting's or her's, and speculated that Suspect/ Nosal

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03 had brought them in, "hoping to cast suspicion on a man". She stated
04 that Suspect/ Nosal was "obviously trying to kill me" and was certain
05 that Suspect/ Nosal brought the boots in to "try to make it look like
06 a man did it". (Note: I met with Subject/ Keting in the hospital
07 following this interview and he indicated that the writing on the hat
08 , "LADDOK", may be associated with an insecticide or a herbicide
09 company as a promotional item connected with Suspect/ Nosal's work in
10 agriculture.

11 Noting the severity of the attack, Victim/ Shoeman
12 indicated that Suspect/ Nosal must have had blood on her and that her
13 car should have blood in it as well. Victim/ Shoeman : did not know
14 where Suspect/ Nosal would go to clean up the blood or dispose of
15 any bloody items.

16 Victim/ Shoeman: stated that Suspect/ Nosal is in love with
17 Subject/ Keting and that was her motive for the attack.
18 Victim/ Shoeman said she has been with Subject/ Keting for five
19 years and that they have maintained an open relationship, seeing and
20 sleeping with other people. She said Suspect/ Nosal is Subject/
21 Keting's lover and admitted that she, Subject/ Keting and
22 Suspect/ Nosal had "threesomes" on several occasions. Victim/
23 Shoeman stated that, lately, Suspect/ Nosal has been "wanting more
24 and more" of Subject/ Keting and his time. Victim/ Shoeman
25 said she thought Subject/ Keting was feeling pressured by
26 Suspect/ Nosal and she had told him not to let suspect/ Nosal push
27 him. Victim/ Shoeman stated that she was casual friends with

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02 Note, Victim/ Shoeman asked if I were speculating that
03 Subject/ Keting . may be involved in her attack and had purposely
04 left the door unlocked. Victim/ Shoeman : stated that she is
05 "positive he was not involved" in the attack. Victim/: Shoeman said
06 she is certain that Suspect/ Nosal . was her attacker; stating, "If I
07 hadn't seen her I wouldn't believe it either. I wouldn't believe
08 she's a violent person". She speculated that Suspect/ Nosal . may be
09 upset because she was limiting Subject/ Keting's time with her and
10 may have thought that she (Shoeman) would forbid him to see her.
11 Victim/ shoeman recalled that Suspect/ Nosal once questioned her
12 to make sure that Victim/ Shoeman was not upset by Suspect/ Nosal's
13 relationship with Subject/ Keting. Victim/: Shoeman stated "her
14 words, she wanted to know if I would come after her with a knife".
15 Advised of speculation that her wounds were self-inflicted,
16 Victim/ Shoeman stated, "I knew people would say I did" because
17 nobody would want to believe that she (Nosal) did it". Victim/
18 Shoeman admitted to having attempted suicide in the past. She
19 related that, in 2004, she tried to slit her wrists with a meat
20 cleaver after a breakup with her boyfriend. She stated that she
21 "barely broke the skin and couldn't do it". She said she immediately,
22 called her therapist (Lisa Davies.), who took her to St. Joseph's
23 Hospital where she spent a week in the psychiatric unit. (Note: She
24 indicated that she spent one year in therapy with Lisa Davies)
25 Victim/ Shoeman stated she last suffered from depression in the fall
of 2008 and was prescribed the antidepressant drug, Zolof, but did not
27 seek therapy. She indicated that she quit taking Zolof six months
