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03     FURTHER INVESTIGATION            On 7/31/01 I, Det. Grimes, contacted Det.

04     Sgt. Nicks, TX 517-353-            , of the Michigan State Univ. Police

05     Department in regards to camera and security systems at the campus

06     greenhouses. He indicated that no cameras or security systems, which

07     could verify Suspect/ Nosal's alibi, were present at the

08     greenhouses. He indicated that greenhouse personnel or staff may

09     have seen Suspect/ Nosal on, 7/30/01, and could be checked to verify

10     her alibi. Subsequently I contacted Suspect/ Nosal's advisor,

12     INTERVIEW W/SUBJECT/IRIS.            Subject/ Iris indicated that she

13     arrived at her Plant and Soil Science Building office at approximately

14     9:00 AM, and left at approximately 12:00 PM, on 7/30/01. She said

15     that, sometime between those hours, she saw Suspect/ Nosal. She

16     recalled that Suspect Nosal told her she was not going out to the

17     fields because it was too wet. Subject/ Iris stated, "it would make

18     sense" that Suspect/ Nosal had already been in the fields because it

19     was sporadically raining throughout the morning. Subject/ Iris said

20     the greenhouses open at 7:30 AM and she provided the names of the

21     greenhouse managers; Doug Motea, TX 517-355-            , in the Plant and

22     Soil Science greenhouse and Dave Waylon, TX 517-355-7454, in the

23     Pesticide Research greenhouse. Subject/ Iris indicated that

24     Suspect Nosal has two weed plots at the Pesticide Research Center.

25     Also, Subject/ Iris noted that she knew two students, Andy and Mike,

26     who were in the fields during the morning, 7/30/01; but they had not

04 Subject, *Iris* was able to define LADDOK as the name of a

05 herbicide used on corn. She said that, to get such a cap, someone

06 would probably be connected to agriculture - but due to the high

07 number of agricultural students at MSU, there are many such caps in

08 the area. Subject, *Iris* said she had seen Suspect/ *Nosal* wear a

09 dark hat with white print but could not be certain if it was a LADDOK

10 hat.

11 ADDITIONAL SEARCH On 7/31/08 I returned to the Oak Meadows

12 condominium complex to further search for the weapons and/or possible

13 witnesses to the incident. Subject/ *Keting* allowed me into the

14 unit and I conducted a second room by room search. No further

15 evidence was recovered. Outside I checked the perimeter of the

16 building and edge of a nearby pond with negative results. I was

17 unable to contact nearby neighbors but business cards were left, at

18 their doors, with instructions to contact me. No witnesses to the

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03    ADDITIONAL INFORMATION    On 8/1/    Subject/: Keting contacted me

04    indicating that he had discussed the attack with Victim/ Shoeman : in

05    hopes of helping her clear her memory. He said she remembered

06    dropping the knife when she was struggling with Suspect/ Nosal to

07    open the door. He also indicated that she never really saw a wrench;

08    only a flash and a red handle (Note: During a subsequent re-interview

09    with Victim/ Shoeman it was noted that she still believes she was

10    struck with a wrench). Additionally, Subject/ Keting said that

11    when he returned to work he found a message indicating Suspect/

12    Nosal had called him on Tuesday, 7/30/ , at approximately 9:00 AM.

13    He stated that his boss, Jim Polk, took the call. Subject/

14    Keting related that Suspect. Nosal has called him at work in the

15    past and that it's not strange for her to call him at work or in the

16    morning. However, he said he did not expect to hear from her on

17    Tuesday morning because they had just spoken on Monday evening.

18    Subsequent contact was made with Subject/ Polk and he

19    confirmed that Suspect/: Nosal had called Subject/ Keting at work

20    on 7/30/ . Subject/ Polk stated he had received the call at

21    approximately 9:00 AM, about ten minutes after Subject/ Keting

22    left. He recalled that Suspect/ Nosal asked for Steve and was told

23    her that he had left work because a friend had been hurt. He said

24    that she did not ask about the hurt friend and only left a message for

25    Steve that she had called. Subject/ Polk could not recall any sense

26    of emotion in her voice. He related that he wrote a note for Subject/

27    Keting but did not record the time of the call.



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03                    Later, on 8/1/96, I was contacted by Subject, Iris who

04                    stated she had found a staff person at the Pesticide Research Center,

05                    Frank Jenks, who had seen Suspect/Nosal on the morning of

06                    7/30/96. She related that everyone else she had asked did not see

07                    Suspect/Nosal until later in the day.

08                    FURTHER INVESTIGATION                    Next, contact was made with Dave Waylon

09                    manager of the Pesticide Research greenhouse. He said that he does

10                    not know Suspect/Nosal and there is no means to verify if a person

11                    has been in the greenhouse. He related that the greenhouse is an open

12                    area which is not restricted and a high volume of people move through

13                    the area. Subject/Waylon stated that the only way to verify if

14                    Suspect/Nosal had been there is if she were recognized by someone

15                    who knew her.

16                    Contact was also made with Doug Moleo, manager of the Plant

17                    and Soil Science greenhouse. Subject Moleo stated that he does know

18                    Suspect/Nosal but that he did not see her on Tuesday morning,

19                    7/30/96.

20                    Lastly, contact was made with Frank Jenks, TX

21                    517-353-                    Subject, Jenks stated that he knows Suspect, Nosal

22                    and related that he saw her on Tuesday morning, 7/30/96, while in the

06                    In an effort to gain more information regarding the work  
 07 boots found at the scene, I contacted the Meijer Thrifty Acres  
 08 department store located directly across from the condominium  
 09 complex. At the store I made contact with Loss Prevention detectives  
 10 who identified the boots as "Dickies Ultra 4X4"; boots stocked by  
 11 Meijer. A check of the store's sales records indicated that none of  
 12 those boots, in men's size 9 1/2, had been sold within the last  
 13 month. The Loss Prevention detectives said that the boot is a popular  
 14 style and is carried in many stores. No further information could be  
 15 obtained regarding the boots. However, the store maintained  
 16 surveillance video tapes of their parking lot and I was able to review  
 17 the tape for 7/30/' . Reviewing surveillance footage of the store  
 18 parking lot, I did not observe Suspect / NOSAL : vehicle or  
 19 Suspect / NOSAL on the Meijer property between 7:30 AM and 8:55 AM on  
 20 7/30,' I checked the berm, separating Meijer from Oak Valley Drive  
 21 and the condominium complex, for evidence but found nothing. No new  
 22 evidence at this time.
