1st conditional

<i>If</i> I <u>fail</u> the exam, I <u>will be</u> sad.	
<u>Form</u>	Meaning
IF + present simple, WILL + infinitive	real and probable situation

2nd conditional	
If I won a million crowns, I would travel round the world.	
<u>Form</u>	Meaning
IF + past simple, WOULD + infinitive	unreal and improbable situation
