<u>Topic</u> to be decided by speakers

Media any media you feel comfortable with

computer, handouts, board, CDs or any combination

<u>Speakers</u> A. prepare questions for your audience – to be asked at the beginning or end

- if asked at the beginning, you will check them at the end, audience makes notes while listening to you
- you may have questions as an emergency instrument in case your colleagues have no questions during or after your talk
- B. to make your talk more interesting games, crosswords, matching exercises, pictures

OPTIONAL prepare for *pre-teaching* terminology/expressions key words you expect your listeners <u>don't know</u> expressions and concepts that are <u>difficult to understand</u>

**<u>Audience</u>** prepare for asking questions and to discuss ideas

**Length** 15 to 20 minutes including discussion
