# VERB FORMS

## Regular – adding –ED/-D

work – worked  
close

play – played

want – wanted

close –

stop – stopped

cry – cried

post – posted

push – pushed

warn – warned

hate – hated

## Irregular

see – saw

be – was/were

run – ran

have – had

read – read

can – could

etc.

# VERB FORMS 2

## Positive sentences

She enjoyed the laboratory assay very much.

## Yes/No Questions

Did she enjoy the assay?

## Wh-Questions

When/Why did she run the test?

## Negative sentences

No, she didn't run/enjoy the test.

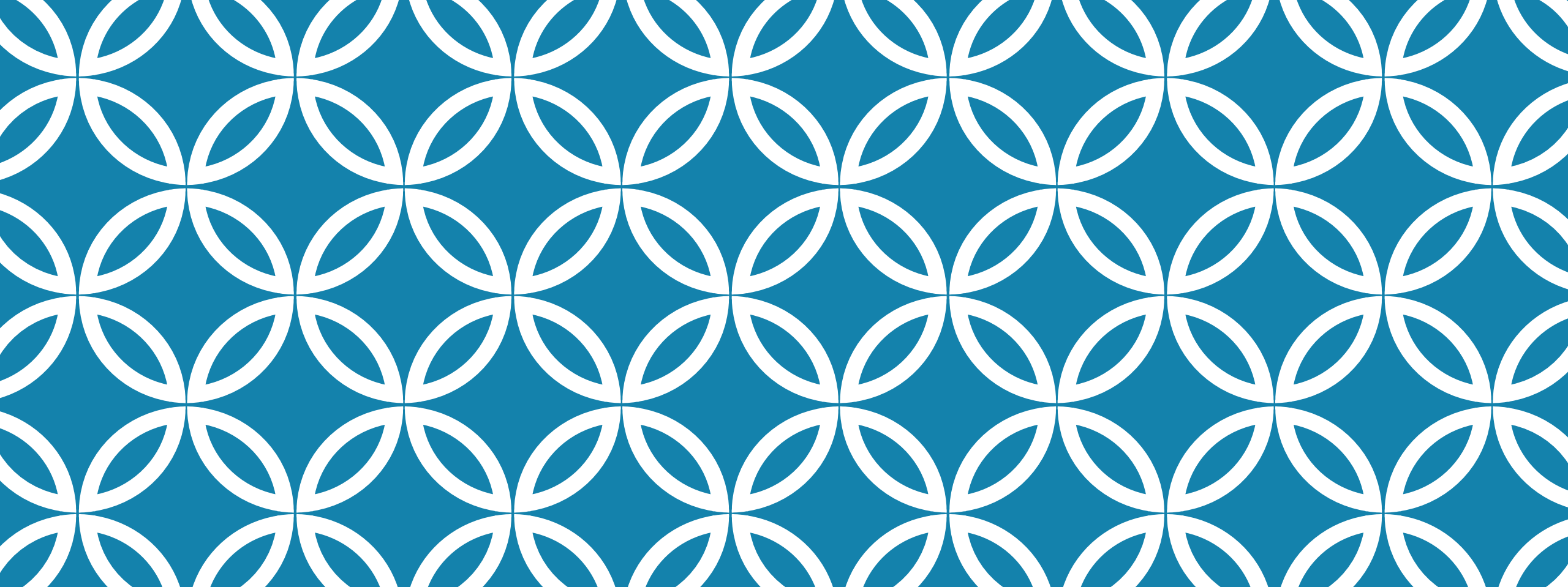
# PAST SIMPLE USE

Finished events, activities or states:

Einstein died in 1955. He became famous for his theory of relativity.

Events that happened at a specific time in the past:

In 1921, Einstein received a Nobel Prize in Physics.

She	was	listening	to music.
We	were	revising	for the test.
They		cooking	dinner.

# VERB FORMS 2

## Positive sentences

He was running to school.

## Questions

Was he studying?

What was he studying?

## Negative sentences

He wasn't studying.

# PAST PROGRESSIVE USE

I was doing sth = I was in the middle of doing something at a certain time.  
The activity started before this time and didn't finish.

What were you doing at 10 am yesterday?

This time last year, I was living in Brazil.

I waved to Helen, but she wasn't looking.



# PAST SIMPLE / PAST PROGRESSIVE

We often use Past Simple and Past Progressive together to say that something happened in the middle of something else.

I was running the electrophoresis when Joe moved the tank.

He was trying to apologize, but I went away.
