Formal Requirements

<u>Topic</u> to be decided – as given in the suggestions list

Media any media you feel comfortable

Speakers A. prepare questions for your audience – to be asked at the beginning or end

- if asked at the beginning, you will check them at the end, audience makes notes while listening to you
- you may have questions as an emergency instrument in case your colleagues have no questions during or after your talk

B. OPTIONAL

games, crosswords, matching exercises, pictures

pre-teaching terminology/expressions

key words you expect your listeners <u>don't know</u> expressions and concepts that are <u>difficult to understand</u> expressions <u>difficult to pronounce</u>

<u>Audience</u> ready to answer questions & ask questions

give feedback = evaluate the presenter with constructive criticism – something you liked and something that could be improved

Length 1 speaker: 10 plus 5 minutes+(pre-teaching), questions, and discussion

2 speakers: 15 plus 5 minutes+(pre-teaching), questions, and discussion

DO NOT:

- **READ YOUR PRESENTATION** (however, you can have short notes)
- don't recycle the info from the INTERNET = paraphrase, summarize, express differently, use your own words
- FORGET TO INCLUDE YOUR SOURCES IN THE

PRESENTATION (WebPages, books, journals – put them at the end of the presentation)

- USE TOO MANY VISUALS AND TOO MUCH TEXT ON THE SLIDES (they might become distracting)
- **SPEAK IN LOW/QUIET VOICE** (every student in the class needs to hear you)
- **FORGET TO PREPARE A DISCUSSION** (ALWAYS anticipate discussion questions, prepare for them and have your own questions ready)
