

## The system of summary evaluation of Pharmacology I and Pharmacology II courses 2019

The final evaluation of the course contains also results of the tests from practicals of both semesters and results of colloquium test.

**The final mark in the course Pharmacology II (aVLFA0822p) is calculated by following method:**

Relative weight of the mark from tests: **40 %**

Relative weight of the mark from oral exam: **60 %**

To calculate **mark from the tests** the following method will be used:

The summary score from all tests in courses VLFA07212c, VLFA07212p, VLFA08222c, and VLFA08222p is 230 pts. Minimum to pass through the course to the oral exam is 116 pts.

A = 191-230 pts

B = 171-190 pts

C = 153-170 pts

D = 135-152 pts

E = 117-134 pts

F = less than 116 pts

To calculate **mark from the oral exam** the following method will be used:

Three different questions are chosen by students from three different sets of questions at oral exam. Moreover the student answers additional questions of examiner. Each of drawn questions has relative weight of 20 % and the additional questions relative weight of 40% in the final mark of the oral exam. When student is evaluated by F for any of these questions the overall rating of oral exam is also F.

In case of success with the ROPOT test, but classification F from the oral part, students enter the oral part next time and for the final mark the score from the last ROPOT attempt is used.

### **Autumn semester**

#### Practicals (max 45 pts min 20 pts)

3x MCQ (each 15 pts)

1x prescription test

To get the credits at least 6 points from each MCQ test and summary at least 20 pts from these tests must be scored. Moreover student has to pass prescription test and attend at least 14 of practical lessons.

#### Lecture - colloquium (max 80 pts min 40 pts)

The course credits are given after passing of the colloquium test = min. score 40 pts.

## **Spring semester**

### Practicals (max 45 pts min 20 pts)

3x MCQ (each 15 pts)

1x prescription test

To get the credits at least 6 points from each MCQ test and summary at least 20 pts from these tests must be scored. Moreover student has to pass prescription test and attend at least 14 of practical lessons.

### Lecture (max 60 pts min 36 pts)

The exam consists of ROPOT test and oral part. Students sit the ROPOT prior of the oral exam on the same day and the test is a part of the exam. If student fails in the test the mark F is given for the exam. If student passed the ROPOT, but failed in the oral part, it is not necessary to repeat the ROPOT prior the next attempt in the oral part. The ROPOT can be repeated at most twice. After third fail in the ROPOT, student can ask the head of the department for the date of exceptional oral exam and minimal value to pass the test is used for the calculation of the final mark.

### **Description of the tests:**

*MCQ in practicals* – 15 questions, 3-5 answers, number of correct answers stated. 1 point for correctly answered question. No minus points for incorrect answers. Time limit 15 minutes. One resit is allowed in case of fail in one of the test.

*Prescription test* – 2 RMP. The indication, pharmacotherapeutic group or the purpose of the use of the preparation is given. Test is evaluated as passed/failed. Test can be repeated at most twice.

Principal mistakes:

HVLP – incorrectly selected preparation (incorrect active substance pharmaceutical form or incorrect dosing with respect to SPC, basic mistakes in the formal prescription rules (missed blue stripe or 2 and more mistakes making the prescription invalid).

*MCQ exam /colloquium*– 30/40 questions, 3 to 5 answers, number of correct answers stated. 2 points for correctly answered question. No minus points for incorrect answers. Time limit 45/60 minutes. Two repeats are allowed in case of both fail and pass in the test.
