fetus, us, m.



CHILDHOOD

newborn

neonatus, i, m.

morbus haemolyticus neonatorum

bleeding disorders of newborns due to a vitamin k deficiency at birth



CHILDHOOD

baby < 1 year

infans, is, m/f

haemangioma infantile benign vascular tumour in children



ADOLESCENCE

puberty

pubertas, atis, f.

pubertas praecox – early pubertypubertas tarda – late puberty

scoliosis (gr. curvature) – S or C shaped spine disorder that may worsen during puberty

why? [sudden growth thrusts]




ADOLESCENCE

coxa vara adolescentium

osteonecrotical change of the collum femoris near the epiphysial plate starting in puberty

adolescens, ntis, m/f development after childhood



ADOLESCENCE

morbus osgood-schlatter

osteochondrosis deformans juvenilis

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osteochondrosis, is, f. - orthopedic disease of children / adolescents
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oste- (gr. bone)
chondro- (gr. cartilage)
-(o)sis (gr. non degenerative / non inflammatory)
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juvenilis, e - young

(this is my dad by the way)




ADULTHOOD

for example: arthrosis, is, f.

arthr- (gr. joint)
-osis (gr. non degenerative / non inflammatory disease

joint degeneration – wear / tear of cartilage

can you see the difference between arthrosis and arthritis?



OLD AGE

old age – senium, ii. n. old (adj.) – senilis, e

dementia senile

mental deterioration (loss of intellectual ability) associated with characteristics of old age



OLD AGE

geriatria

treatment of the elderly and their diseases

reffering to old age = (gr.) geronto-



OLD AGE

morbus parkinson idiopathicus

loss of mainly dopaminergic nerve cells which causes a neurotransmitter deficiency

idiopathicus, a, um
(gr. "ones own" + "suffering")

= without known reason / source

"shivering / shaking disease"


