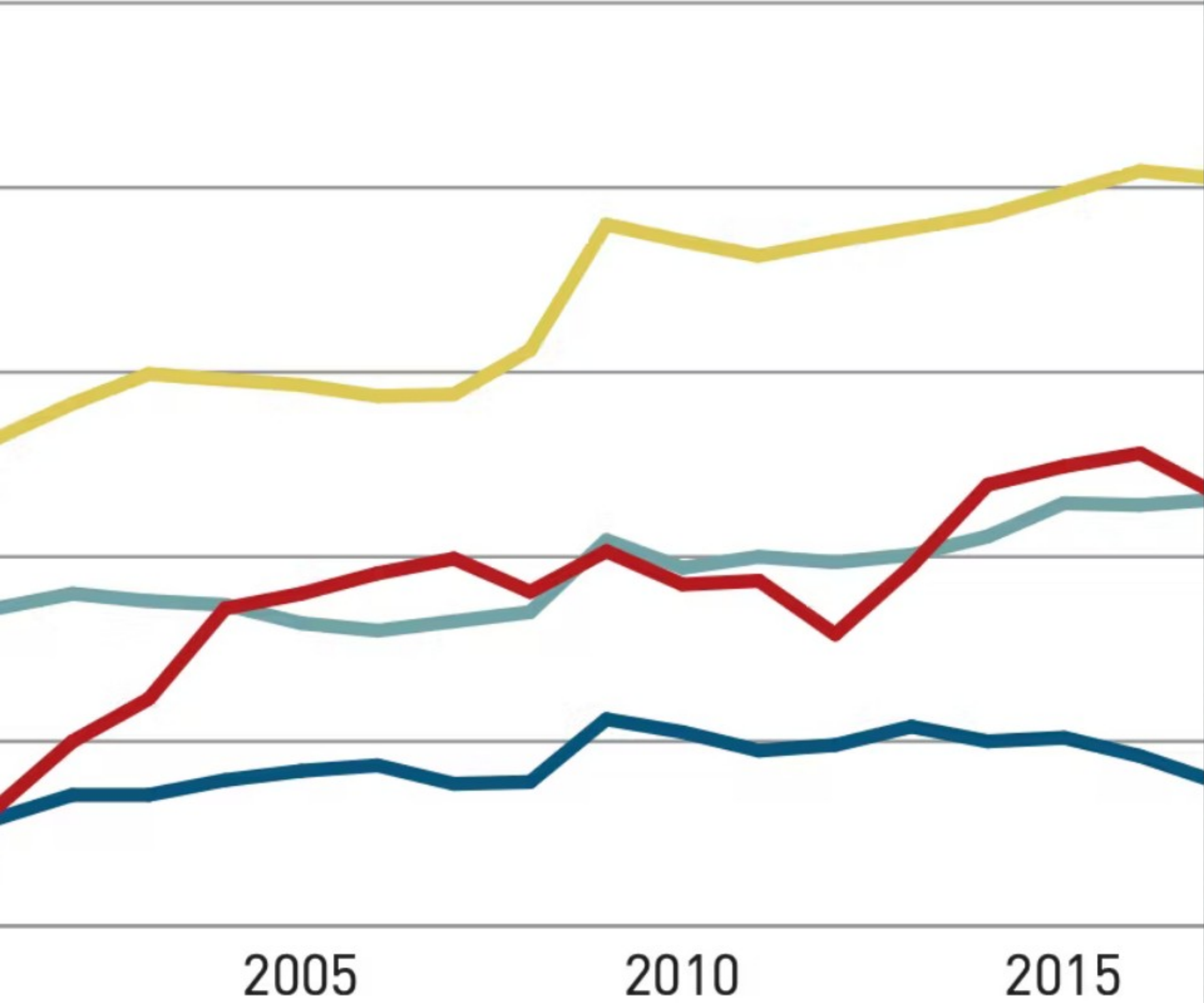
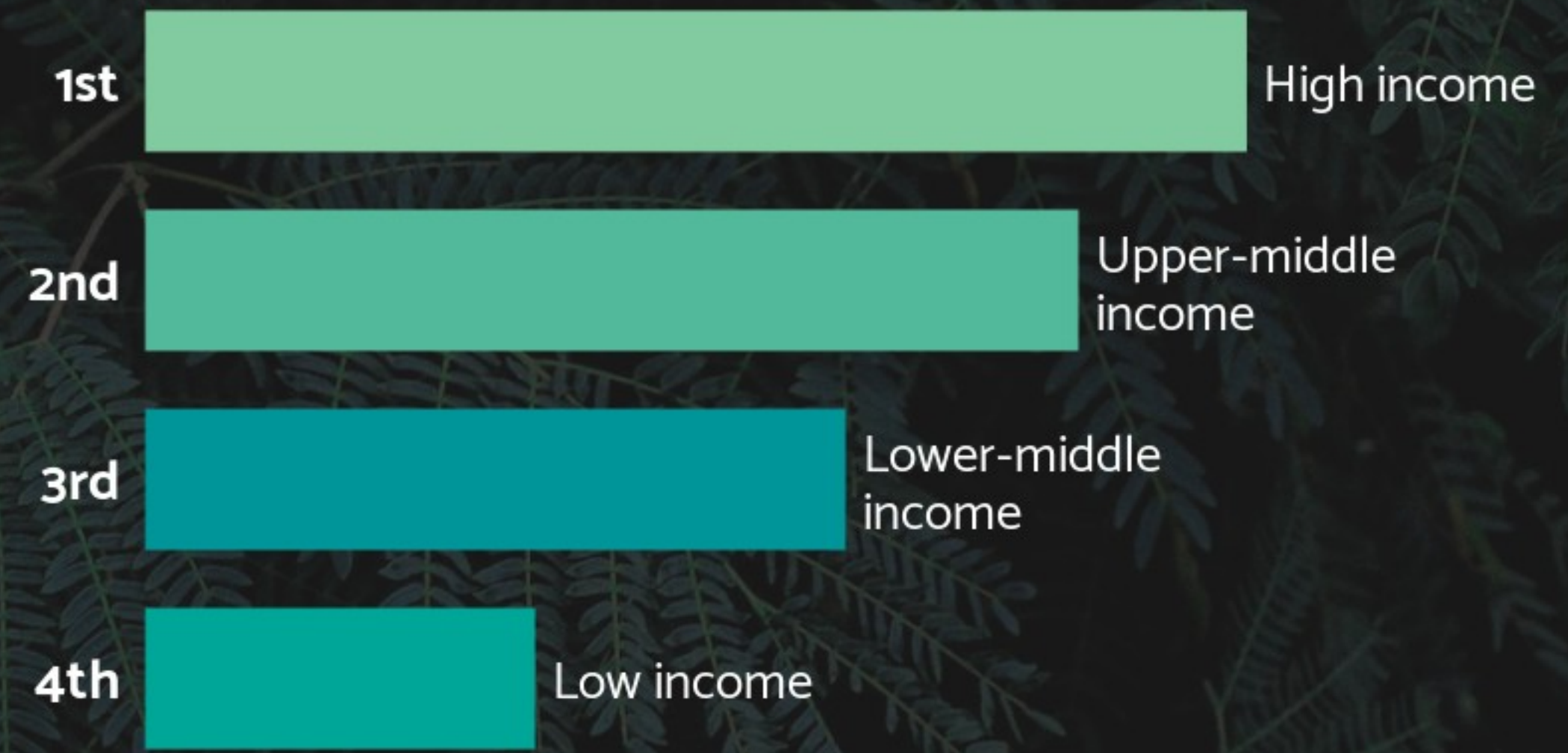


spending (% of GDP)

What might Dan Pallotta mean by saying, "The global nonprofit sector (health) does not have a brain or a voice."

There is not a strong well-known leader as in private sector

Voice and brain are costs that don't go directly to the cause so are badly seen by the public, therefore impeding nonprofit sector to invest on itself

They are both actively suppressed by the for-profit sector and lack a unanimous concept that consolidates their main core principles.
