Passive 2 (be done / been done / being done)

passive: (to) be + done/cleaned/seen etc. The room will be cleaned later.
active: (to) do/clean/see etc. Somebody will clean the room later.

passive: (to) have been + done/cleaned/seen etc. The room must be done before it's too late.

active: (to) have + done/cleaned/seen etc. A mystery is something that can't be explained.

passive: (to) have been + done/cleaned/seen etc. The music was very loud and could be heard from a long way away.

active: (to) have been + done/cleaned/seen etc. A new supermarket is going to be built next year.

passive: (to) have been + done/cleaned/seen etc. Please go away. I want to be left alone.

active: (to) have been + done/cleaned/seen etc. If you hadn't left the car unlocked, it wouldn't have been stolen.

passive: (to) have been + done/cleaned/seen etc. I haven't received the letter yet. It might have been sent to the wrong address.

active: (to) have been + done/cleaned/seen etc. If you had cleaned the concert has been cancelled.

passive: (to) have been + done/cleaned/seen etc. Have you ever heard that someone has been invited?

active: (to) have been + done etc. Are you going to the party? No, I haven't been invited.

passive: had been + done etc. The room looked nice. Somebody had cleaned it.

active: had + done etc. The room looked nice. Somebody had cleaned the room.

passive: am/is/are + doing etc. The car was three years old but hadn't been used very much.

active: am/is/are + doing etc. The vegetables didn't taste very good. They had been cooked too long.

passive: am/is/are + being done etc. There's somebody walking behind us. I think we are being followed.

passive: was/were + being done etc. (in a shop) Can I help you? No, thank you. I'm being served.

active: was/were + doing etc. Somebody was cleaning the room when I arrived.

Present continuous
active: am/is/are + (do)ing Somebody is cleaning the room at the moment.

passive: am/is/are + being (done) The room is being cleaned at the moment.

Past continuous
active: am/is/are + (do)ing Somebody was cleaning the room when I arrived.

passive: was/were + being (done) There was somebody walking behind us. We were being followed.
