RELATIVE PRONOUNS

- Who, whom, which, that, whose
- The choice of RP depends on whether you refer to:
 - a person, animal or thing
 - a subject or an object
 - a possessive meaning

WHO/THAT

• Refer to human beings

That's the man who broke my arm. (subject)

It was from a man **who** I know slightly. (object) It was from a man <u>whom</u> I know slightly.

I met a friend **who** I went to school **with**. I met a friend <u>with whom</u> I went to school. (formal)

WHICH/THAT

Refers to a non-human subject or object of a relative clause

The heart is a muscle **which/that** pumps blood. (S/O?)

The heart is a muscle (**which/that**) you should take care of. (S/O?)

The heart is a muscle of which you should take care.

WHOSE

• Used for possession by humans and animals

The man whose house burnt down got a stroke.

Compare:

He wrote a novel, the title **of which** I've forgotten. (formal)

He wrote a novel, **whose** title I've forgotten.

DEFINING/NON-DEFINING RELATIVE CLAUSES

 The heart, which is a fascinating organ, is located in the thoracic cavity.

(=there are other fascinating organs)

The heart which he received works well.
(=a specific heart)

DEFINING/NON-DEFINING RELATIVE CLAUSES

• Defining:

The doctors who were unhappy with their situation went on strike.

(=not all the doctors, just those who were unhappy)

Non-defining

The doctors, who were unhappy with their situation, went on strike.

(=all the doctors)

Cf The doctors, who were members of MSF, went on strike. (=extra information)

Task: The doctors who were members of MSF went on strike. (=who?)

NON-DEFINING RELATIVE CLAUSES

• The heart, which is a fascinating organ, is divided into four chambers.

(=correct)

 The heart, that is a fascinating organ, is divided into four chambers.

(=incorrect)
