

HOW DO WE DERIVE WORDS IN MEDICAL TERMINOLOGY

- ↗ 1) **Derivation**
 - ↗ a) Prefix: ante-brachium; ana-lysis
 - ↗ b) Sufix: brachi-alis; nephritis
 - ↗ c) Prefix + sufix: ante-brachi-alis; para-nephritis
- ↗ 2) **Composition**: prim-i-para; pneum-o-thorax
- ↗ 3) **Derivation + composition**: nas-o-lacrim-alis; haemat-ur-ia
- ↗ 4) **Abbreviation**: DM; CT; HIV, AIDS
- ↗ 5) **Borrowings**: shock; stress

BASIC TERMINOLOGY

Medical words, like many other words consist of 3 basic component parts:

- ↗ **ORIGIN:** LATIN/GREEK prepositions and their phonological variants
- ↗ **ROLE:** SPECIFY/RESTRICT/CHANGE/ALTER the meaning of the derived word
 - ↗ **Ad**ductor vs. **Ab**ductor
- ↗ **POSITION:** AT the BEGINNING of the word
- ↗ **MEANING:**
 - ↗ **TIME/PLACE**
 - ↗ **DEGREE**
 - ↗ **DEVIATION/CORECTNESS**


