<p>LAESIO, ONIS, F. (lesion = any pathological or traumatic damage of tissues or loss of function, a broad term including wounds, sores, ulcers, tumors, etc.)</p>	<p><i>Laesio ligamenti musculi flexoris digitorum manus l. sin.</i></p>
<p>DEFORMITAS, ATIS, F. (deformity, deformation)</p>	<p><i>Deformitas antebrachii l. dx. gravis</i></p>
<p>LACERATIO, ONIS, F. (laceration = a wound caused by the tearing of tissues)</p>	<p><i>Laceratio tendinis musculi extensoris indicis l. sin.</i> <i>Laceratio renis sin. gr. IV.</i></p>
<p>CONTUSIO, ONIS, F. (contusion = injury to tissues with skin discoloration and without breakage of the skin)</p>	<p><i>Contusio femoris l. sin. cum haematomate musculi quadricipitis femoris l. sin.</i> <i>Contusio lienis gr. III.</i></p>
<p>HAEMATOMA, TIS, N. (haematoma = accumulation of blood outside blood vessels)</p>	<p><i>Haematoma epidurale regionis temporalis susp.</i></p>
<p>PERFORATIO, ONIS, F. (perforation = a wall or break in the walls or membranes of organs/tissues)</p>	<p><i>St. p. perforationem vesicae felleae</i></p>
<p>DISTENSIO, ONIS, F. (strain = an injury to a muscle or tendon in which the muscle fibres tear as a result of overstretching)</p>	<p><i>Distensio musculi recti abdominis l. dx.</i></p>
<p>EXCORIATIO, ONIS, F. (scrape = skin surface removed)</p>	<p><i>Excoriationes faciei, manus l. utr. et genus l. utr. superficiales</i></p>
<p>COMMOTIO, ONIS, F. (concussion = a violent jarring or shaking that results in a disturbance of brain function)</p>	<p><i>Commotio cerebri cum fissura ossis temporalis l. sin.</i></p>

DISTORSIO, ONIS, F. (sprain, distortion = a sudden or violent twist or bending of a joint)	<i>Susp. distorsionis columnae vertebralis partis cervicalis</i>
LUXATIO, ONIS, F. (dislocation)	<i>Fractura partis proximalis humeri l. sin. comminutiva cum luxatione</i>
ABRUPTIO, ONIS, F. (breaking off, abruption)	<i>Abruptio partis ventralis corporis vertebrae C7 v. s.</i>
COMBUSTIO, ONIS, F. (burn)	<i>Combustio thoracis, cervicis et faciei gr. II.</i>
CONGELATIO, ONIS, F. (frostbite)	<i>Congelationes extremitatis inferioris l. utr. gr. I.</i>
DECUBITUS, US, M. (bedsore , pressure sore, decubitus = a pressure induced ulceration of the skin usually occurring in persons confined to bed for a long time)	<i>Decubitus regionis calcanei et ossis sacri gr. II.</i>

vulnus contusum (bruised wound)	<i>vulnus contusum femoris l. utr.</i>
vulnus scissum (cut wound caused by pulling, e.g. knife)	<i>vulnus scissum pollicis l.dx.</i>
vulnus sectum (cut wound caused by falling down, e.g. axe)	<i>vulnus sectum capitis reg. occipitalis</i>
vulnus sclopetarium (shot wound)	<i>mors propter vulnus sclopetarium reg. frontalis</i>
vulnus punctum (stab wound)	<i>vulnus punctum reg. epigastrii</i>
vulnus morsum (bite wound)	<i>vulnus morsum regionis antebrachii l.dx.</i>
vulnus lacerum (torn wound with uneven edges)	<i>vulnera lacera palpebrae superioris l.sin.</i>
