


Arch of aorta?






Oblique line of
lower jaw?



Gen. sg. **-I**

Gender: M./N. (+ F. = exceptions)

Nom. sg. **-US/-ER/-OS** = M. (F.)

Nom. sg. **-UM/-ON** = N.

NERVUS = paradigm for 2nd declension masculines (and feminines) of *Latin* origin

NEPHROS = paradigm for 2nd declension masculines of *Greek* origin

- : differences between the paradigms
- = nom. sg. (-US vs. -OS)
- = accus. sg. (-UM vs. -ON)

SEPTUM = paradigm for 2nd declension neuters of *Latin* origin

COLON = paradigm for 2nd declension neuters of *Greek* origin

- : differences between the paradigms
 - = nom. sg. (**-UM** vs. **-ON**)
 - = accus. sg. (**-UM** vs. **-ON**)

RULE FOR all Latin NEUTERS!

- 1) nom. (sg./pl.) = accus. (sg./pl.)
- 2) nom. pl. = accus. pl. = **-A**
