How do you say...?



- Use this phrase to ask for translation into czech language.
- Task: think about one czech word you really need to know. Ask me for it using this phrase.

How is that written?



- Spelling is not a big deal in Czech language.

Do you understand? – I don't understand.

Other important phrase.

- Ano, rozumím. (Yes, *I understand.*)

- *Once more / one more time, please.*

- *„I have a question“ question will be ignored. 😊*

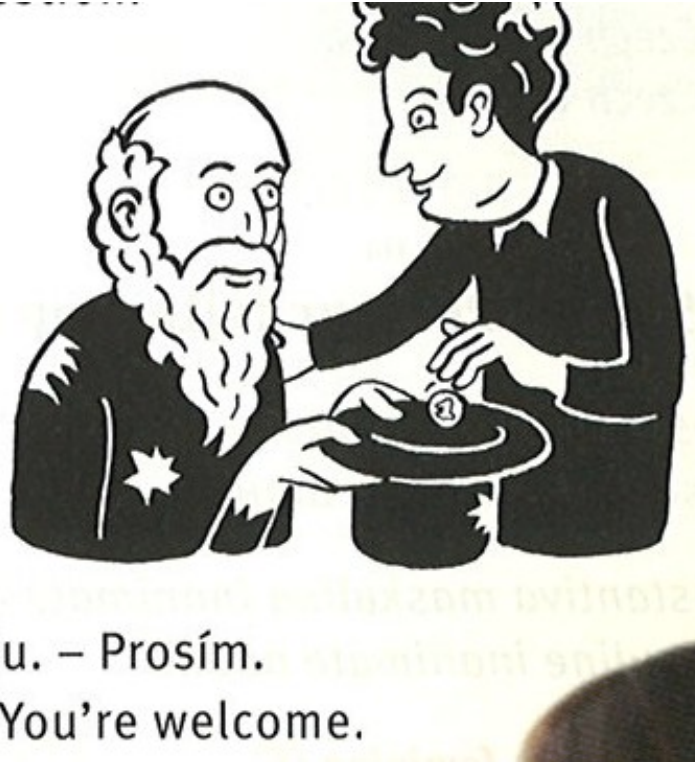
