verb *to have* (mít)

how to work with this verb

1 | infinitive + finite forms

regular or irregular verb? Both...

- you have to remember both the infinitive (*mít*) and the first person form (*mám*), or the stem (*má-*) and type (M-ending)

mít

mám = I have
máš = you have
má = he/she/it has

máme = we have
máte = you have
mají = they have

2 | negative forms

simply put NE to the beginning

nemám = I do **not** have

nemáš = you do **not** have

nemá = he/she/it does **not** have

nemáme = we do **not** have

nemáte = you do **not** have

nemají = they do **not** have

Useful/ basic phrases

mít is used a lot in Czech; even where it is not used in English

- Jak se máte? Mám se dobře. *How are you? I am fine. (lit. I have myself good.)*
- Ne/mám problém. *I do not have a problem.*
- Ne/mám peníze. *I do not have money.*
- Mám lekci. *I have a class.*
