Peripheral → lymph node










Lymph node – capsule, subcapsular (marginal) sinus, cortex




Lymph node – capsule, subcapsular (marginal) sinus, cortex




Lymph node – cortex, medulla


Blood circulation in the spleen






Spleen (HE) – white and red pulp, trabeculae




Spleen (HE) – white and red pulp, central artery








Thymus young – cortex and medulla, Hassal's corpuscles




Thymus in involution







