

# Shops and Shopping



## A Shops and shopping

shop assistant: person who works in a shop; also called sales assistant shop window: the window at the front of the shop shopping centre: a place with many shops, outside or indoors shopping list: a list of things to buy window shopping: to look round the shops but not buy anything

I did the shopping yesterday (= I bought food and household goods) I went shopping yesterday (= I went to the shops to buy food or clothes, etc.)



## Types of shop (and what they sell)

department store Name of shop

almost everything (furniture, clothes, electrical appliances, e.g. TV and washing machine, toys, jewellery, etc. and sometimes food) food and household goods, e.g. cleaning products newspapers, cigarettes, sweets, stationery, e.g. writing paper, cards What it sells envelopes, etc.

greengrocer('s)

butcher('s)

boutique

newsagent('s) supermarket

fashionable clothes fruit and vegetables

medicine, baby products, shampoo, soap, toothpaste, etc.

Note: Most other shops are just '+ shop', e.g. shoe shop, record shop, camera shop, etc.

Useful words and expressions

ASSISTANT: Can I help you? CUSTOMER: I'm being served, thanks. (= another assistant is ASSISTANT: Can I help you? ASSISTANT: Can I help you? CUSTOMER: No, I'm just looking, thanks. (= I don't need help) CUSTOMER: Yes, I'm looking for (= I want) a blue jumper. already serving/helping me)

CUSTOMER: Where's the changing room? (= the room where you try on clothes; also called ASSISTANT: What size are you looking for? (e.g. big? small? medium? 12? 14? 16?)

ASSISTANT: It's down there on the right.


CUSTOMER: Yes, I'll take this one / these. (= Yes, I want

CUSTOMER: No, I'll leave it thanks. (= No, I don't to buy this one / these)

CUSTOMER: Excuse me. Where do I pay for these? want to buy it/them)

CUSTOMER: And can I pay by cheque / credit ASSISTANT: Over at the cash desk/till.

ASSISTANT: Yes, of course.

grocer's wholefood store / healthfood shop greengrocer's dairy / milk-shop / milkman / milkround confectioner's / sweetshop / candy store (US) confectionery / sweets fishmonger's: wet fish (GB) / seafood shop (US)

corner shops - small shops run by Indians, Chinese, Italians, Greeks and Poles and others selling their respective foods, and open 24 hours

Other products haberdasher's

jeweller's optician's dispensing chemist (GB) / pharmacy (US) / drugstore (US)

florist's / flower-stand bookshop (GB) / bookstore (US)
second-hand bookshop (GB) / used books (US) record shop newsagent's / news stand ironmonger's (hardware) electrical appliances (in GB firms such as Dixon's), hi-fis, CD players, VCRs glassware china shop antiques giftshop D.I.Y. (do-it-yourself) shop: tools, appliances, materials toyshop camera shop sports goods
