## How to correct the incorrect sentences

First - you must remember 3 types of conditional sentences 0, 1 and 2

If + present tense, present tense

If I get up in time, I'll go swimming. 1 - a possible or likely future event or situation

If + present tense, will

If I got up in time, I'd go swimming. 2 - an imaginary or unreal event or situation If + past tense, would
