

Tertiary age 18–21/22 (but you can study at university as a mature student at any age) optional		Based on results in secondary- school leaving exams. Some institutions also have interviews and entrance tests.	
Post-graduate over age 21 optional		You need an excellent qualification from your university (e.g First or upper-second Honours degree).	МВА
