
The medical profession

after (= care for / take care of) others: doctor, nurse, surgeon (= a specialist doctor who works in a hospital and operates on people), dentist, and vet (= animal doctor). The word These people treat (= give medical treatment and try to solve a medical problem) and look 'vet' is a short form for 'veterinary surgeon'.
