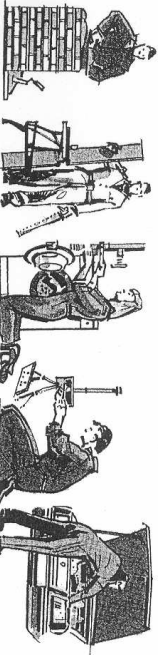
The medical profession

The word 'vet' is a short form for 'veterinary surgeon'.

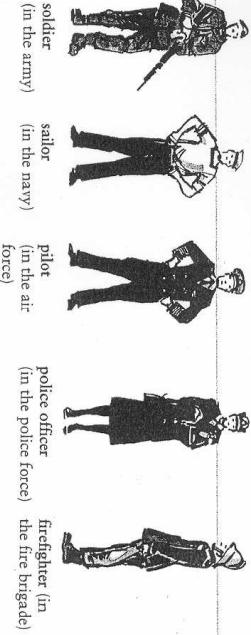

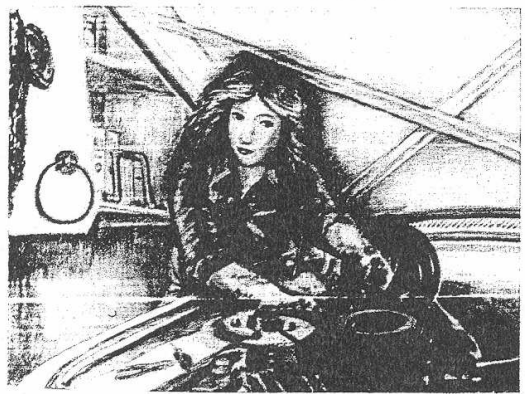
