- The only word in the English language that has four sets of double letters in row

# Queue

- the only word that is still pronounced the same way when the last four letters are removed

The most common letter in English

E

# Lipogram

= a text written without using a particular letter of the alphabet.

# Subbookkeeper

- the only word with four pairs of double letters in a row
- = (a person who works underneath the main bookkeeper)

# Goddessship

- the only word in the English language with a triple letter

- The longest Czech sentence without any vowels.

- Smrk z Brd pln skvrn z mlh strhl smršť zrn z prh.

(prha arnika – rostlina)

- Smrž pln skvrn zvlhl z mlh.
