

### **CONDITIONALS**

## 1) FIRST CONDITIONAL

#### Form:

- If + present tense, + will + base form of verb
  - o **If** it **rains**, I'**II** stay at home.
- Will + base form of verb (no comma) + if + present tense
  - o I'll stay at home if it rains.

#### Use:

The first conditional expresses a *possible condition* and *a probable result* in **FUTURE**.

$\hbox{\tt CONDITION}{\longrightarrow}{\longrightarrow}{\rightarrow}\hbox{\tt RESULT}$	${\sf RESULT} {\rightarrow} {\rightarrow} {\rightarrow} {\sf CONDITION}$	
If I see Jane, I will tell her.	I will tell Jane <b>if I see</b> her.	
If it rains tomorrow, we'll stay at home.	We'll stay at home <b>if it rains</b> tomorrow.	
If Simon gets a cheap flight, he will go to London next week.	Simon will go to London next week if he gets a cheap flight.	
If I don't pass the exam, I'll be sad.	I'll be sad <b>if I don't pass</b> the exam.	

## 2) SECOND CONDITIONAL

#### Form:

- If + past simple, would + base form of verb
  - o If I had some money, I would travel around the world.
- would +base form of verb (no comma) if + past simple
  - o I would travel around the world if I had some money.

#### Use:

The second conditional expresses a *hypothetical condition* and *its probable result*. We use the past tense although the speaker is talking about the **PRESENT** or **FUTURE**.

If I had some money, I would travel around the world. (.... But I don't have the money, so I can't travel anywhere.)

If she was younger she would start her own business. (....But she is too old to do it now.)

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#### English D: Grammar: Conditionals 2

### **NOTES:**

- ✓ With "I" and "he/she/it" we often use "were" instead of "was" in conditional sentences, especially when we write. It is more formal: If I were you, I would write him a letter.
- ✓ Where appropriate, we can also use "could" or "should" instead of "would".

# 3) THIRD CONDITIONAL

### Form:

- If + past perfect, would + past infinitive (= "have + past participle")
  - If I <u>had earned</u> enough money, I would <u>have travelled</u> around the world.
     OR
  - o I would have travelled around the world if I had earned enough money.

### <u>Use:</u>

The third conditional expresses an *unreal condition* and *its probable result* in the **PAST**.

If I had earned enough money, I would have travelled around the world. (.... But <u>I didn't earn</u> enough money, so <u>I couldn't travel</u>.)
