

1 Tense changes in reported speech (backshift of tenses)

present simple	past simple

present continuous	past continuous		
"The sun is shining."	She said (that) the sun was shining.		
past simple	past perfect		
"There was a terrible storm."	She said (that) there had been a terrible storm.		
present perfect	past perfect		
"I haven't seen him."	She said (that) she hadn't seen him.		
am going to	was going to		
"I'm going to move to Prague."	She said she was going to move to Prague.		
will	would		
"I'll call him later."	She said (that) she'd (= she would) call him later.		
can	could		
"I can see many problems in that."	She said (that) she could see many problems in that.		
may	might		
"I may win."	She said (that) she might win.		
might	might		
"I might win."	She said (that) she might win.		
must	had to		
"I must read that book!"	She said she had to read that book.		
mustn't	mustn't		
"You mustn't tell Sally the secret!"	She said we mustn't tell Sally the secret!		

could, would, should, might, used to DON'T CHANGE when they are reported at a later time!!!

2 Verbs used for reporting

3 Reporting offers, advice and promises

"I'll be a good leader." – He promised to be a good leader. "You should do it." – She advised me to do it. "We could help you." – They offered to help me.

4 Reporting questions

When reporting questions we must keep <u>the word order of a statement</u>!!! "What's the weather like?" – Rachel asked **what the weather was like**. (NOT what was the weather like.) "How do you feel?" - Rachel asked James how he felt. (NOT how did he feel.)

Yes/no questions – reported with <u>if/whether</u>:

"Can you hear me?" - Rachel asked if James could hear her.

5 References to time, place etc.

Unless we are speaking on the same day, we have to change references to time we report what someone said:

- yesterday =>the day before
- today=> that day
- tomorrow=> the next day
- next week=> the following week
- now=> then

Other changes

- here=> there
- this=> that

E.g. "I saw him here yesterday". She explained that she had seen him there the day before.
