




Belt Cave

- 6 km from Caspian Sea between forest and grassland and marshes
- Wadi in front flooded lower layers
- 28 levels, Early Mesolithic, Late Mesolithic and Neolithic
- Lower Mesolithic was "flint factory" with few faunal remains
- Upper Mesolithic had few flints, but lots of bones – a living site






Belt Cave section.

- 3 jumbled skeletons and an isolated skull of a young female.
- Adult male's bones had red ochre
