Activities

Gán 緊 and jyuh 住

gan2

zyu6

The aspect markers **gán** 緊 and **jyuh** 住 attached to verbs express ongoing actions.

hai2 dou6

Progressive **gán** 緊 and **háidouh** 喺度

The progressive suffix **-gán** 緊, like the English progressive '-ing', is used for ongoing activities:

keoi5 ji4 gaa1 hoi1 gan2 wui2

佢而家開緊會

She's having a meeting.

keoi5 dei6 loeng5 go3 king1 gan2 gai2 .gai

佢哋兩個傾緊偈

The two of them are chatting.

Although referring most often to the present, verbs with **gán** 緊 may apply to an activity in the past. In such cases, there is typically a past time adverb present to make this clear (see Unit 11; note also the adverb **zung6** 仲 'still'):

gau6 nin2 keoi5 **zung6** duk6 **gan2** zung1 hok6 舊年佢仲讀緊中學

Last year she was still studying in secondary school.

keoi5 dei6 **soeng6** go3 **jyut6** **zung6** paak3 **gan2** to1, ji4 **gaa1** ji5 **ging1** **fan1** zo2 **sau2** laa3

佢哋上個月仲拍緊拖, 而家已經分咗手喇

Last month, they were still dating; now they're already separated.

gan2

Similarly, **gán** 緊 may be used in subordinate clauses referring to the past:

ngo5 duk6 gan2 siu2 hok6 go2 zan6 si4, keoi5 ji5 ging1 sik1 ngo5

我讀緊小學嗰陣時, 佢已經識我

(lit. I studying primary school that time, he already knew me)

When I was in primary school, she already knew me.

nei5 fan3 gan2 gaau3 go2 zan6 si4, jau5 jan4 daa2 din6 waa2 lai4

你瞓緊覺嗰陣時, 有人打電話嚟

(lit. you sleeping that time, somebody telephoned come)

Somebody called while you were sleeping.

hai2 dou6

An alternative means of describing an ongoing action is by using **háidouh** 嚟度, which literally means ‘to be here/there’:

ngo5 hai2 dou6 zou6 gung1 fo3

我嚟度做功課

I’m (here) doing homework.

nei5 hai2 dou6 dang2 bin1 go3 aa3?

你嚟度等邊個呀?

Who are you waiting for?

keoi5 dei6 hai2 dou6 aai3 gaau1

佢哋嚟度嗌交

They’re having an argument.

Because of the literal meaning 'here', it is suitable where the activity is going on in a location close to the speaker. **háidouh** 喺度 and **gán** 緊 can also be used together in expressing progressive meaning:

keoi5 hai2 dou6 zyu2 gan2 faan6

佢喺度煮緊飯

She's cooking.

lou5 baan2 hai2 dou6 se2 gan2 seon3

老闆喺度寫緊信

The boss is writing letters.

Continuous zyu6 住 Mandarin: zhe 著

zyuh 住 added to a verb describes a continuous activity or state without change. It is associated with particular verbs, such as those denoting stationary situations:

gaa3 din6 daan1 ce1 zo2 zyu6 go3 ceot1 hau2 架電單車阻住個出口

The motorbike is blocking the exit.

keoi5 sing4 jat6 zaa1 zyu6 fan6 bou3 zi2 佢成日揸住份報紙

She's always holding a newspaper.

ngo5 jat6 jat6 deoi3 zyu6 tung4 jat1 baan1 jan4 **baan yahn** 我日日對住同樣一班人

I face the same bunch of people every day.

Note that verb + **iyuh** 住 can mean something different from the simple verb by itself, such as **nam2 zyu6** 諗住 'intend' versus **nam2** 諗 'think' versus **tai2 zyu6** 睇住 'watch over' versus **tai** 睇 'look, see':

ngo5 nam2 zyu6 ceng2 keoi5 dei6 sik6 faan6 我諗住請佢哋食飯
I intend to invite them to dinner.

nei5 tai2 zyu6 ni1 loeng5 go3 sai3 lou6 zai2, m4 hou2 bei2 keoi5 dei6 daa2 gaau1
你睇住呢兩個細路仔, 唔好畀佢哋打交
Keep an eye on these two kids, (and) don't let them fight.

A verb with **zyu6** 住 can also be used to describe an action carried out simultaneously with another:

keoi5 mong6 zyu6 ngo5 siu3 佢望住我笑
(lit. he watching me smiled)
He smiled (while looking) at me.

keoi5 deoi3 zyu6 ngo5 haam3 佢對住我喊
She cried at (while facing) me.

nei5 gan1 zyu6 ngo5 haang4 你跟住我行
Walk after (following) me.

Note that there is no conjunction linking the two verbs (which is a characteristic of the sequences of verb phrases known as serial verb constructions, see *Intermediate Cantonese*, Unit 11).

Gán 緊 versus jyuh 住

Since both may be translated with progressive '-ing' forms in English, it can be difficult to choose between **gán** 緊 and **jyuh** 住. As a general rule, **gán** 緊 is appropriate for activities involving change or movement and **jyuh** 住 for static

ones. In many cases, either is possible, sometimes with a marked difference of meaning:

a keoi5 lo2 gan2 di1 wun6 geoi6

佢攞緊啲玩具

He's fetching the toys.

b keoi5 lo2 zyu6 di1 wun6 geoi6

佢攞住啲玩具

He's holding the toys.

a keoi5 zoek3 gan2 saam1

佢著緊衫

She's getting dressed.

b keoi5 zoek3 zyu6 tiu4 dyun2 kwan4

佢著住條短裙

She was wearing a short skirt.

a keoi5 daai3 gan2 tiu4 zyun3 sek6 geng2 lin2

佢戴緊條鑽石頸鏈

She's putting on a diamond necklace.

b keoi5 daai3 zyu6 tiu4 zyun3 sek6 geng2 lin2

佢戴住條鑽石頸鏈

She's wearing a diamond necklace.

In each case **gán** 緊 indicates a dynamic, changing situation and **jyuh** 住 a static one.

Exercise 19.1

Add **gán** 緊 and/or **háidouh** 喺度 to express progressive aspect in the following sentences:

Example keoi5 tai2 syu1 佢睇書 She's reading (a book). →
Keuih tai-gan syū 佢睇緊書

- 1 ngo5 ji4 gaa1 wun6 saam1 我而家換衫 I'm changing (my clothes) now.
- 2 keoi5 dei6 kam4 maan5 daa2 maa4 zoek2 佢哋琴晚打麻雀 They were playing mahjong last night.
- 3 keoi5 gong2 din6 waa2 佢講電話 She's (talking) on the phone.
- 4 ji4 gaa1 lok6 jyu5 而家落雨 It's raining now.
- 5 di1 sai3 lou6 zai2 waan2 seoi2 啲細路仔玩水 The children are playing with water.
- 6 ngo5 dei6 haang4 lai4 我哋行嚟 We're coming (walking) over.
- 7 keoi5 ji4 gaa1 cung1 loeng4 佢而家冲凉 She's taking a shower.
- 8 ngo5 go3 zai2 waak6 waa2 我個仔畫畫 My son is drawing.
- 9 lou5 baan2 hoi1 wui2 老闆開會 The boss is having a meeting.
- 10 keoi5 zung6 nau1 ngo5 dei6 佢仲撈我哋 She's still angry with us.

Exercise 19.2

Add **gán** 緊 or **jyuh** 住 as appropriate to complete the following sentences:

Example ngo5 sai2 saam1 我洗衫 I'm washing clothes. → Ngóh sái-gán
sāam 我洗緊衫

 - 9 ngo5 ji4 gaa1 daap3 man6 tai4 我而家答問題 I'm answering questions right now.
- keoi5 sing4 jat6 zoek3 di1 gau6 saam1 m 佢成日著啲舊衫 He's always wearing old clothes.

UNIT 21

Passives

Cantonese passives are signalled by **bei2** 畀 phrase similar to the English *by* phrase. The **béi** 畀 phrase (**béi** 畀 + a noun phrase indicating the agent of the action) occurs before the verb:

di1 syut3 gou1 bei2 di1 sai3 lou6 zai2 sik6 zo2 啲雪糕畀啲細路仔食咗

(lit. the ice cream by the children eaten)
The ice cream was eaten by the children.

bun2 syu1 bei2 go3 hok6 saang1 ze3 zo2 本書畀個學生借咗

The book was borrowed by a student.

ngo5 go3 zai2 bei2 sin1 saang1 fat6 gwo3 我個仔畀先生罰過

My son has been punished by the teacher.

The noun phrase denoting the agent of the action is obligatory in spoken Cantonese, in contrast to English and Mandarin which allow agentless passives. When the identity of the agent is unknown or left unspecified, the word 人 'person' or 嘢 'thing' is used generically:

ngo5 go3 ngan4 baau1 bei2 jan4 tau1 zo2 我個銀包畀人偷咗

My wallet was stolen.

Kei5 keoi5 sing4 jat6 bei2 jan4 aak1 佢成日畀人呃

He often gets cheated.

ngo5 jau6 bei2 je5 ngaau5 can1 我又畀嘢咬親

I've been bitten again.

Note the contrast with the English translations in which the agent is not mentioned at all.

A peculiarity of Cantonese passives is that a passive verb can still take a direct object. This applies especially to those verbs introduced in Unit 16 which take two objects, such as 偷 'steal', 罰 'fine' and 問 'ask':

keoi5 bei2 jan4 tau1 zo2 go3 ngan4 baau1 佢畀人偷咗個銀包

She had her purse stolen.

ngo5 bei2 jan4 fat6 zo2 hou2 do1 cin2 我畀人罰咗好多錢

I was fined a lot of money.

ngo5 m4 soeng2 bei2 jan4 man6 gam3 do1 je5 我唔想畀人問咁多嘢

I don't want to be asked so much.

This possibility gives rise to alternative passive forms for the same idea:

a ngo5 go3 ce1 paai4 bei2 jan4 lo2 zo2

我個車牌畀人擺咗

My licence has been taken away.

b ngo5 bei2 jan4 lo2 zo2 go3 ce1 paai4

我畀人擺咗個車牌

I've had my licence taken away.

a keoi5 gaa3 ce1 bei2 jan4 zong6 gwo3

佢架車畀人撞過

Her car has been dented.

b keoi5 bei2 jan4 zong6 gwo3 gaa3 ce1

佢畀人撞過架車

She's had her car dented.

The first version provides an objective statement of events, while the second focuses on the effect on the person suffering the misfortune.

Exercise 21.1

He has opened the mailbox.

9 keoi5 dei6 sik6 zo2 di1 zyu1 gu1 lik1 ik
佢哋食咗啲朱古力

They have eaten the chocolate.

10 keoi5 daa2 laan6 zo2 zek3 bui1 í
佢打爛咗隻杯

He has broken the glass.
