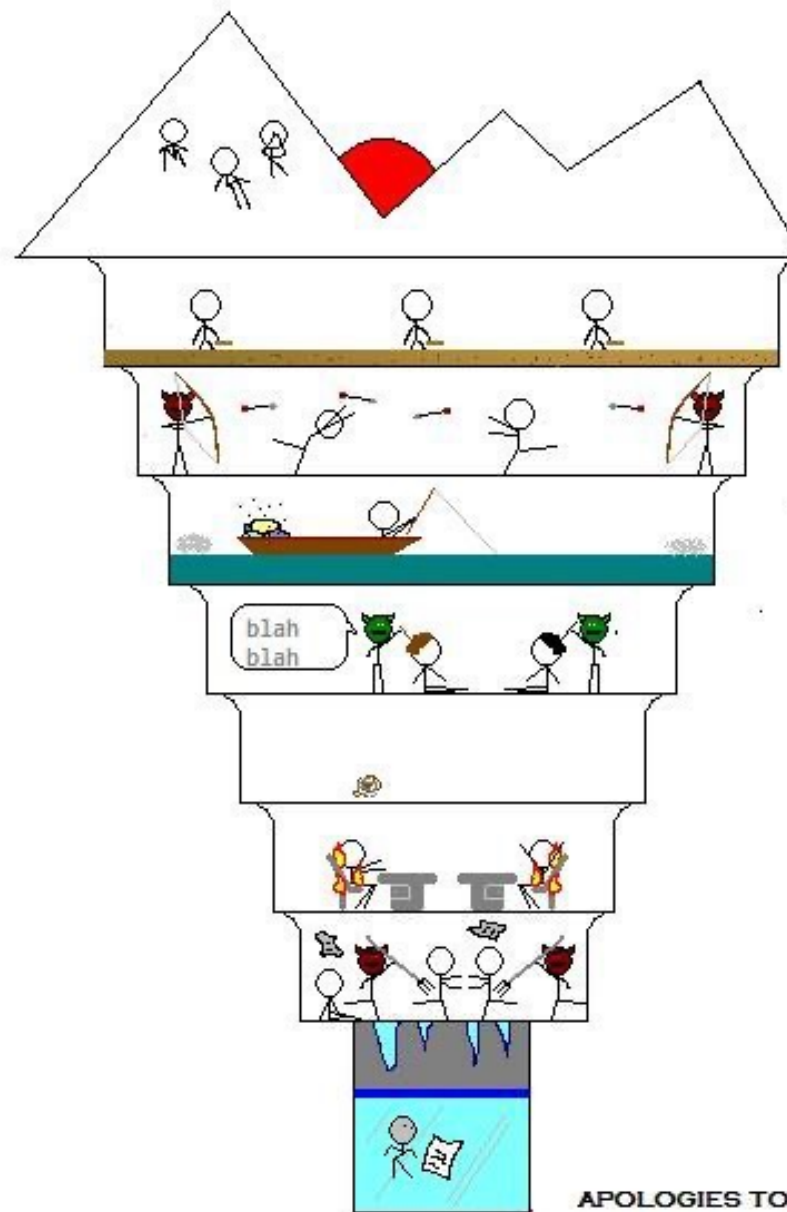

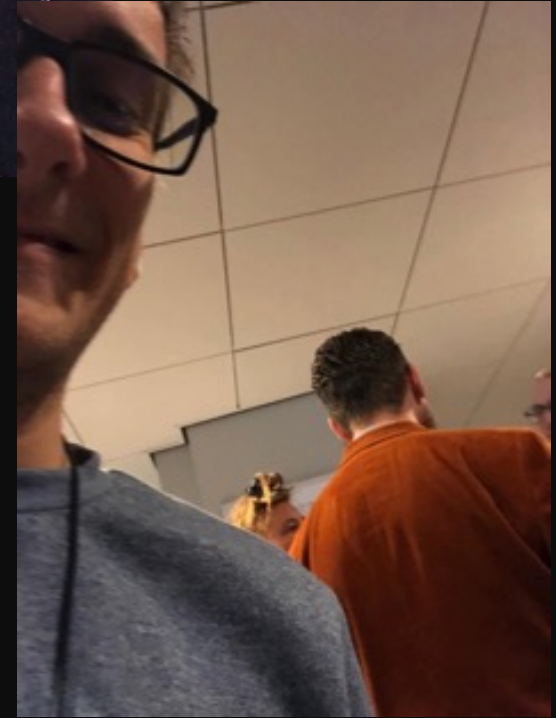

Quizzes

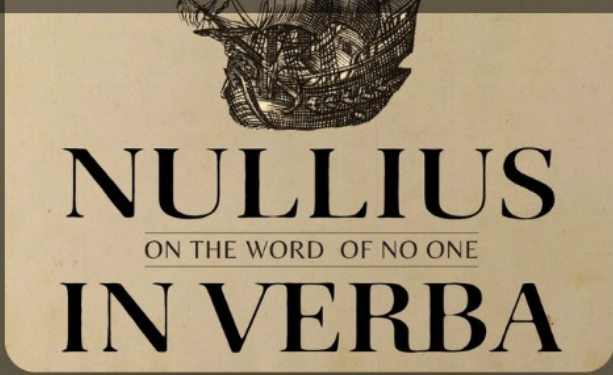
- there will be **five quizzes** altogether

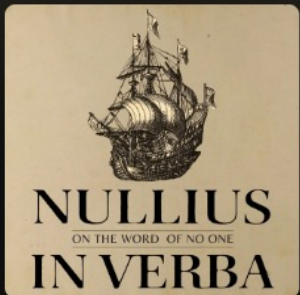
