ABSTRACT

A sondage, made in the spring of 1973 to determine the characteristics of an early prehistoric site near Andimeshk, Khuzistan, Iran, resealed an extensive campground of pastonalists. The campsises and associated middens are Sefid Phase in the Deh Luran chronology. The site TitlaT was occupied for perhaps 200 years during the range 6 200-5900 B.C.

RESUME

Un sondage, effectué au printemps de 1973 en Iran sur un site préhistorique du Khuzistan près d'Andimeshk, a permis de reconnaître un vaste campement de pasteurs. Les vestiges de campement appartiennent à la phase "Sofid" solon la chronologie établie au Deb Loran. Le site, Tülä'i, a été occupé pendant, peut-être, 200 ans, entre 6200 et 5900 av. 


Fig. 7 - Tent sites in Area D showing alignments of stones. Circled area is detail of trash scattered behind tent D4. Outlines of typical tents used by nomads today are superimposed with dashed lines.
