- Hierarchy of images
 - Verbalized imagery
 - Non-verbalized imagery

Metadescription and metaimage

- Metaimage
 - A gestalt image
 - Not verbalized
 - Correlates with compositional structures
 - Perceived subconsciously
 - Influences the perception of the text
 - Reconstructed via foregrounded elements from connotative meanings

Metadescription and metaimage

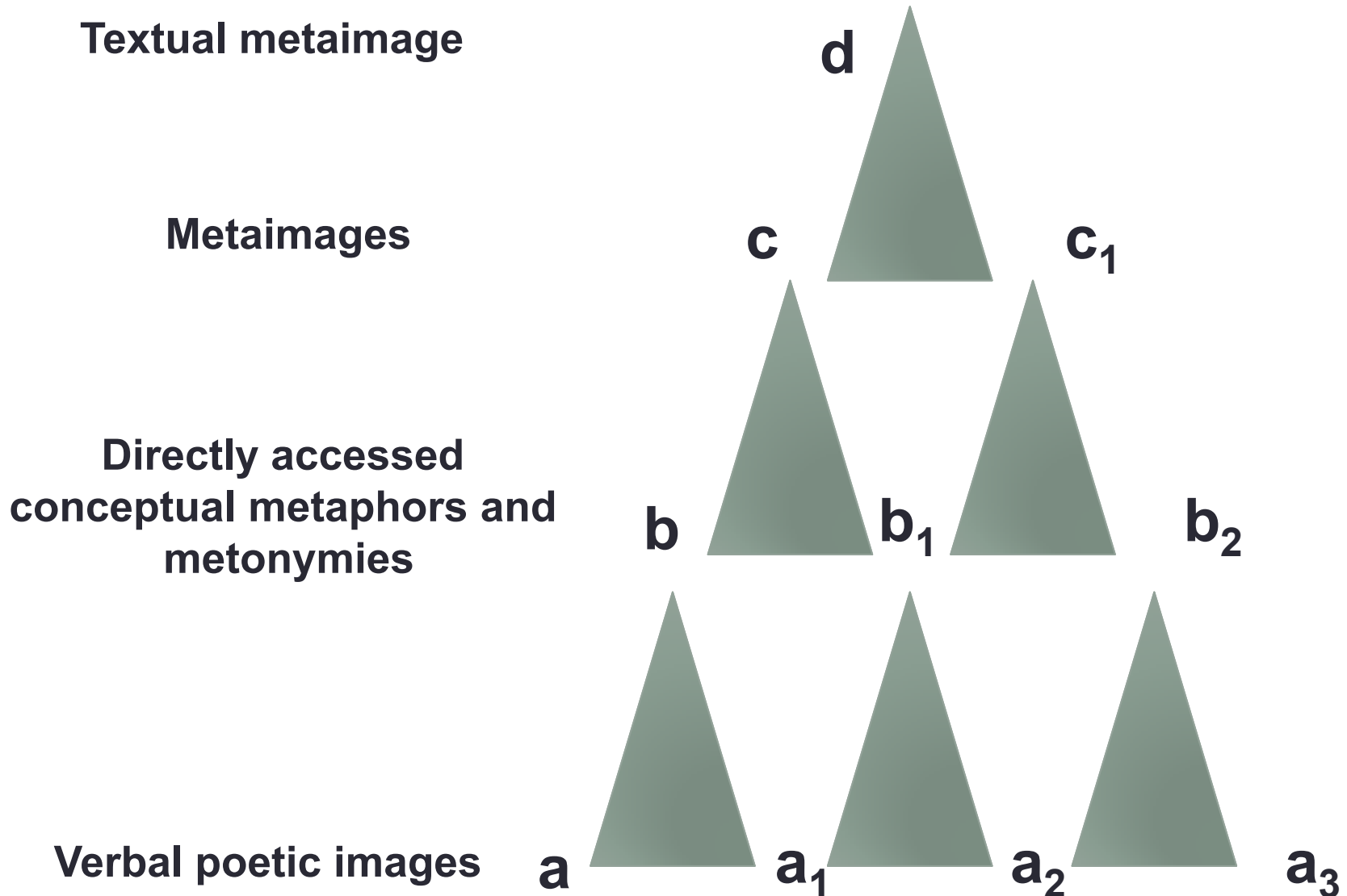
- Metaimage

- Mapping of conceptual domains behind conceptual metaphors and metonymies
- Based on tropes
- Based on semantic coherence of verbal imagery

Metadescription and metaimage

- Eco's *Semiotics and the Philosophy of Language*
 - Micrometaphorics: level of words and word combinations
 - Metaphorics of the context: connecting metaphoric fields
 - Metaphorics of the text: ideological key

Case study: CM and CMt in metadescription

Metaimages	Verbal images
<p>A DAY ON THE ISLAND IS A SAD PERSON</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> – <i>the proud watchful mountains that <u>look down upon all</u></i> (IF, 506) – <i>the forest that <u>sigh in uneasy slumbers</u></i> (IF, 506) – <i>the waters that <u>silently smile</u></i> (IF, 506) – <i><u>meeek hand maiden is the moon</u></i> (IF, 507) – <i><u>sad rivers and melancholy tarns writhing and sleeping within all</u></i> (IF, 508) – <i>that it was scarcely possible to say at which point upon the slope of the emerald turf its [water] <u>crystal dominion</u> began</i> (IF, 509)
<p>A NIGHT ON THE ISLAND IS A SLOW DYING</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> – <i>the <u>sunset fountains of the sky</u></i> (IF, 509) – <i>[trees] <u>wreathing themselves into sad, solemn, and spectral shapes that conveyed ideas of mortal sorrow and untimely death</u></i> (IF, 509) – <i>The shade of the trees <u>fell heavily upon the water, and seemed to bury itself therein, impregnating the depth of the element with darkness</u></i> (IF, 509) – <i>[each shadow] <u>separated itself sullenly from the trunk that gave it birth, and thus became absorbed by the stream</u></i> (IF, 509) – <i>while other shadows issued momentarily from the trees, taking the place of their <u>predecessors thus entombed</u></i> (IF, 509) – <i>the sun <u>rushed down to his slumbers</u></i> (IF, 510)
<p>THE FAY IS A ROWER TO THE LAND OF DEATH</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> – <i>she [Fay] <u>has floated through her winter and through her summer</u></i> (IF, 510) – <i>[Fay's shadow] <u>was swallowed up in the dark water, making its blackness more black</u></i> (IF, 511)
